PRESIDENT ASSELSTINE'S ADDRESS TO MOTORISTS

lected third vice-president of the league. This election came as a complete surprise to me and I feel that it was intended to convey a tribute to our club rather than anything personal to myself.

Among the matters considered at the annual meeting was the insurance of motor cars and steps taken that will in a very short time give insurance to members of this club at a very reduced rate. The matter of a tax on gasoline was also spoken of and the proposition put up did not appear to me to be as unfair as some of the other propositions for raising revenue from motorists. The proposition was to tax half a cent a gallon and in this way the man who used 100 gallons a year driving 2,000 to 3,000 miles yearly would pay an extra \$1 for the use of the roads while the man who drove his car 10,000 miles and upwards would pay in proportion to the number of miles he travelled. In connection with the proposed tax on gas it was pointed out that Ontario was, with two exceptions lowest licensed province in the dominion. License on a Ford car in Ontario is \$14 while in Quebec that car has to pay \$27. The average cost of licenses in Canada is as follows: Nova Scotia, \$26.07; Quebec, \$25.27; Prince Edward Island, \$21.82; New Brunswick, \$20.65; British Columbia, \$18.27; Alberta, \$17.83; Ontario, \$14.19; Manitoba, \$13.63; Saskatchewan, \$13.43. In this connection, the owners of cars paid into the treasuries of the provinces 87 1-3 cents for each man, woman and child in the dominion, while the owners of motor vehicles total 5.3 per cent. of the population.

Local Problems.

There are a number of local problems concerning motor car owners that might well be mentioned here. I feel that the parking of cars on Montreal street should not be permitted unless this street should be made a one way street. When cars are parked there the space remaining is too narrow for two lines of cars to be operated. Another matter is the congestion of traffic on Princess street and other business streets, particularly on Saturday. Some method should be introduced to give motor cars an opportunity of stopping at any place of business they care to and not as now having to go on past by reason of the owners' car or some other car blocking up the front entrance of the store.

SUNNY TALES IN SUNNY LANDS

Beche De Mer.

"And oftentimes things that we despise
Another greatly treasure."
And through the light of other eyes
A feuil perfection measures."

"If you will promise to look up the long words in the dictionary, Teddy," said Uncle Frank, "I will tell you about beche-de-mer, but I absolutely refuse to give a lecture on echinoderms at this stage of the game. Beche-de-mer consists of several species of echinoderms, which I will go as far as to say are sea animals or vegetables, and argo generally referred to as the genus Holothuria. I just call them sea slugs, but I am only Uncle Frank, and it would never do to classify things like that."

"I thought beche-de-mer was a language. I am sure I heard that it was spoken in the South Seas. I remember you did tell me that a very rich soup was made of it, but perhaps, I am thinking of something quite different."

"Well, Teddy, beche-de-mer is collected by queer folk from many different islands, and they talk a sort of lingo that they call all more or less understand. That is what the beche-de-mer language is. I could not tell you how many different speaking people are engaged in the beche-de-mer trade, and they never could get along without some sort of jargon they all understand. There are Chinese, Japanese, Malays, Europeans, Japanese, and hundreds of others engaged in the business in one form or another."

"Tell me about it, Uncle."

"To begin with, Teddy, the word "echinoderms" comes from Greek words: "echinos" meaning "hedgehog" and "derma" meaning skin. That gives you some idea to work on. The odes are from six to fifteen inches in length, and they are cucumber shaped, which reminds me that they are also known as sea cucumbers. The skin is sometimes covered with spicules, or prickles, and is sometimes quite smooth. Sometimes it has "teats" or ambulacral feet disposed in rows. There's another hard word for you to find out the meaning of. It is quite an easy one when you know Latin. There are thirty-five varieties, I understand, but only five varieties are "recognized in commerce."

"They surely are not worth much money, are they, Uncle?"

"The finest grade are brown with "teats" and they sell for about thirty pounds sterling a ton. A large black kind are worth twenty pound, a red-bellied kind sell for fifteen, and a white variety for twelve pounds per ton. Some very fine ones even go as high as one hundred pounds in China, where they are greatly prized. I forgot to tell you that they are also known as "tre-rang." In Fiji they were formerly known as the "rypal fish" and they could only be taken by command of the supreme chief."

"Do the natives cook them, or do anything to them, before export?"

"Yes, they boil them for twenty minutes, split them and gut them, and then smoke or dry them over a brick fire. They are generally dried in sheds or trays. Sometimes they are well soaked in fresh water and gutted before boiling, but that is a detail. The great thing is to get them properly dried and shipped before they go bad. They absorb moisture very quickly and a damp one will spoil a whole bag of them—a loss of about a couple of pounds or so. That's all for to-night, Teddy."
