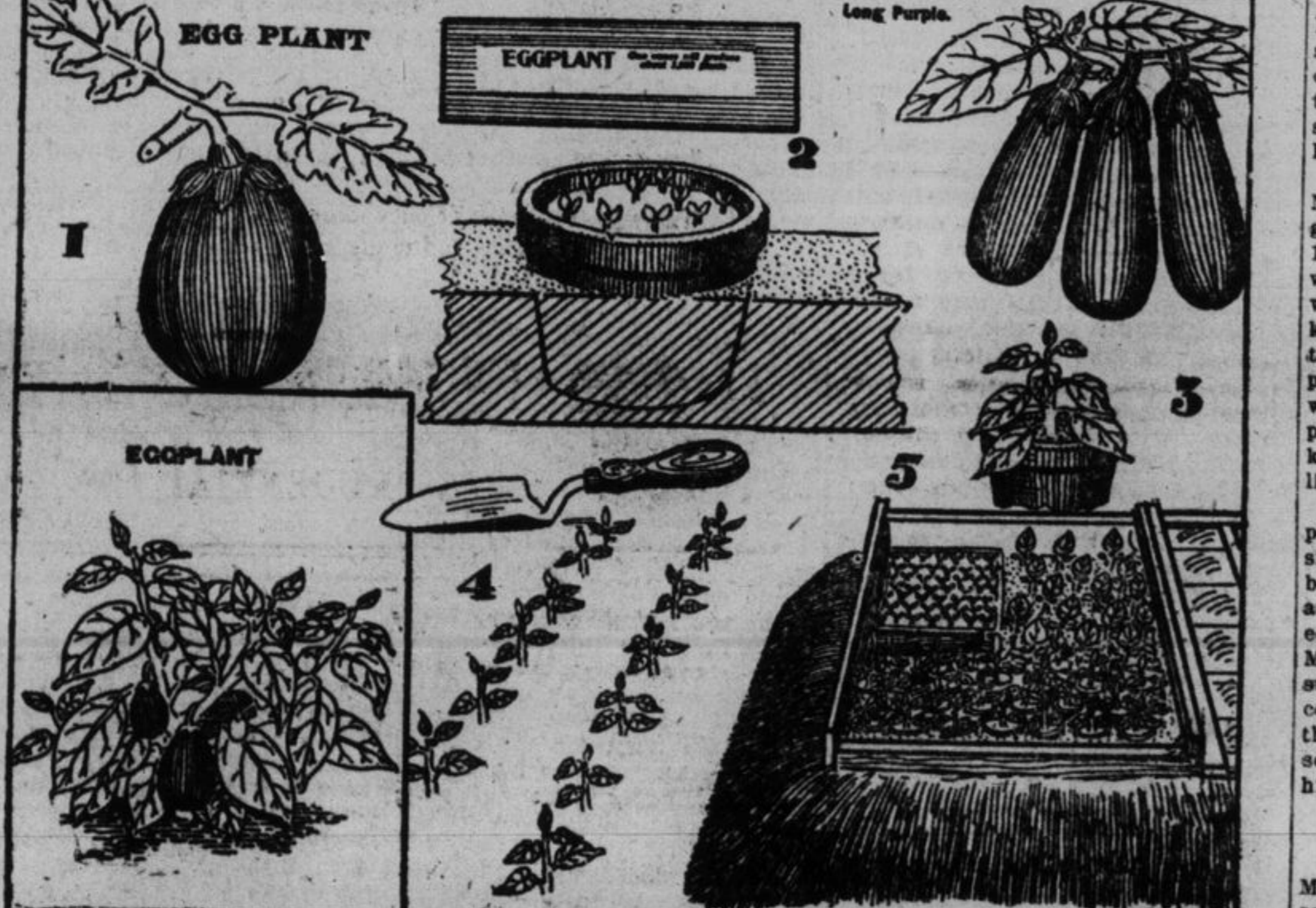

A HOTBED WILL ASSIST YOU TO HAVE AN EARLY GARDEN



All Rights Reserved in U. S., Canada and British Isles by T. Sheward. Hotbeds are easily made and if you have no proper frame you can use an old window for a substitute. To make a hotbed you get fresh horse manure, and heap up a bed about two feet high, tramping this down well as you make it; then set the frame on top and put good soil inside the frame in which to grow the seed. After this you water the bed and set on the glass sash. It is generally ready for sowing three days later. This will need to be covered on cold nights with sacks, and manure should be heaped up around the sides of the frame, as shown at Fig. 12. You can use the frame for growing lots of things besides vegetable plants. Perennials sown now on a hotbed will flower the first year, so you should try such things as Delphiniums, Aquilegias, Pansies, Pentstemonas, etc. You can sow in boxes or on the hotbed, but if you sow in boxes it will be necessary to

HAVE EGG-PLANTS IN THE EARLY GARDEN



All Rights Reserved in U. S., Canada and British Isles by T. Sheward. The Egg-Plant is a native of Northern Africa. It was first introduced into England in 1590, but as the climate was unsuited to its perfect development, it was only grown as a curiosity for many years. In tropical countries, the Egg-Plant is a common article of food. There are several varieties in cultivation, best known of these being Early Black Beauty, New York Improved, Large Purple, Early Long Purple and Black Pekin. Several other sorts are grown, some white, others scarlet, but the former are the standard sorts. Seeds are sown early in the year in hotbeds, the pots or boxes in which they are sown being plunged into the manure to help germination as shown at Fig. 3. When the seedlings are about three inches high they are potted up or transplanted into boxes, but if only a few are required, it is best to use pots as at Fig. 3 and to plunge them in the hot-bed up to the rims as at Fig. 5 so that strong plants are ready for setting outside when the season for planting comes along, about the end of May. You set the plants out in rows, two feet between the plants and three feet between the rows, as at Fig. 4, the soil in which they are planted being well enriched with manure, previously.

TRANSPLANTING FROM HOTBED TO GARDEN SOIL.

Sweet Peas can also be sown in well manured soil, spacing the seeds three inches apart in the rows, to get best results. In the hot-bed there will be a lot of things that need transplanting. The way to transplant is shown at Figs. 3 and 4. Fig. 3 is a box of seedlings, ready for transplanting; Fig. 2 shows how the transplanting is done. Various flower seedlings at transplanting size are shown at Fig. 4. It is time now to make a general sowing of half-hardy annuals for summer bedding. Sow these on a
