Remembered Departing Teacher.
Miss Ophelia Jackson, teacher in Almonte public school for two years has left for Toronto where she joins the teaching staff of the public schools there. Her departure from Almonte is regretted. The Board of Education has given her a very high testimonial and the choir of the Presbyterian Church of which she has been a very active member presented her with a beautiful boudoir lamp, and a felicitous address. Her class in the public school presented her with a handsome camera.

Railways Pleased
The local agents of the Canadian National Railway and the Canadian Pacific Railway are glad to see an organization formed for the purpose of promoting the tourist traffic in Kingston and vicinity. "We want them to come by any means," said one of them, "for when they get here we have the best service in the world, and the best summer climate and scenery in the world. Dr. A. A. Bearup Dead.
Word has been received of the death in Carlisbad, N.M., of Dr. A. A. Bearup, who passed away Easter Sunday. Dr. Bearup was born at Cape Vincent, N.Y., and passed his boyhood in that locality. In early manhood he studied navigation on the St. Lawrence and the Great Lakes but later took a course in dentistry in Toronto University. About 35 years ago he went west and was the first dentist to practice in New Mexico which was then sparsely settled and without railroads. Dr. Bearup performed work for many famous frontier characters in the early days, including Kit Carson, Bill the Kid, and others.

One of Perth's Best Painters.
Another of the older inhabitants of Perth in the person of James Morrison died on April 2nd after an illness of about two weeks with heart trouble. His age was seventy-six years. He was one of Perth's best painters in former days but for some years declining faculties prevented him from following his calling steadily and this was a distinct loss to the trade in this neighborhood. Deceased was for years secretary of the Roman Catholic Separate School Board of Education but took no part generally in public matters. He is survived by his widow, three sons,

Laurence, James and George and two daughters, Misses Clara and Mary.

Liberal In His Views.
Rev. W. Taylor Dale, Dexter, N.Y., and formerly of Kingston, spoke on "Leadership by The Church" before the Jefferson County Ministerial Union at Watertown, N.Y. He was liberal in his attitude in various matters. He said "I do not believe that a man is not a Christian just because he may smoke in moderation. Such prejudices harm the church."
"Shall we ministers say that our people should not go to the movies? I see no reason why they should not go to the movies occasionally. It is wrong to class people as outcasts because they may not measure quite up to our standards."
"What attitude shall we have toward vaudeville? If we stay away from the vaudeville and let it go to the devil, it surely will. People enjoy a change and, while it is true that there is some vulgarity mixed with the vaudeville, should this be done away with, vaudeville would be all right."

Rideau Development.
The members of the Rideau Lakes Development Association got down to business at a meeting held in the Board of Trade rooms Wednesday morning. J. M. Campbell, Elmer Davis, H. C. Nickle and T. A. Kidd were appointed to the board of directors by the council of the Board of Trade, and they held a conference with the representatives from Smith's Falls, Jones' Falls, Elgin, Frontenac county, and Mr. Frazer, Peterboro, Mr. Carruthers, Ottawa, and Mr. Brownlee of the Ontario hotel committee. The matter of chief importance was the selection of the districts to be illustrated on road maps for a guide book, or pamphlet, that is to be published under authority of the association. Other municipalities not represented will be communicated with and given the privilege of selecting space and supplying photographs and other information upon subscribing to the scheme.
