Canada Ships Most Autos to Great Britain

Washington, April 16.—According to a report received from the United States assistant trade commissioner in London, Canada supplied 1,534 of the 2,025 automobiles imported by Great Britain during the month of January, as compared with 216 furnished by the United States, 205 by France and 49 by Italy.

Canadian Fire Losses. Toronto, April 16.—March was another big month as respects fire losses in Canada. According to Monetary Times records, the loss was \$4,429,050, against \$4,520,200 in February, and \$4,331,750 in March, 1922. The losses for the three months, however, were \$11,105,400, against \$11,991,650 for the first quarter of 1922.
