A WAGE REDUCTION IS NOW THREATENED

Pere Marquette Railway Issue Will Be Investigated—Trouble Brewing.

St. Thomas, April 23.—Trouble over threatened wage reductions is again reported to be brewing on the Canadian division of the Pere Marquette railroad, the members of the telegraphers organization being the employees affected this time.

A conference is being arranged in Detroit between the officials of the union and the company and it is hoped that a settlement will be effected.

In the event, however, that an amicable understanding is not reached, it is understood that the federal government will be asked to intervene and to appoint a board under the industrial disputes investigation act.

The company is said to have attempted to introduce a reduced scale of wages for the telegraphers without giving the notice required by the Canadian law. About fifty operators on the division are affected.

Burglars Steal Rare Locket. Toronto, April 23.—A rare English engraved locket over 100 years old, belonging to the late wife of Charles E. Blythe, grocer, 396 Lansdowne avenue, was stolen by burglars Saturday night while Mr. Blythe slept in the house.

The robbers, who entered by an unlocked rear door, stole two watches, a brooch, a locket, a string of pearls, two rings and some cash.
