Have You Made One of the New Bureau Covers?  
The "latest thing" in bureau covers is quite a departure from the long scarf or the oblong cover which

comes to the edge of the bureau-top. This new style cover is made in three pieces:  
How to Make a Three-Piece Dresser Set: The average bureau is about a yard long, perhaps an inch or so longer. For this size bureau-top you will need a yard and an eighth of goods for the cover. Most bureaus of this size are about seventeen inches deep. Therefore the three pieces of the cover-set will consist of two 10-by-4-inch pieces (one for either end) and a middle piece measuring fourteen inches square. This does not allow for the hem; these measurements are for the three dollies when they are finished.  
You will agree with me that this type of bureau cover is most effective when you have finished it and put it on the dresser or dressing table. Each piece should be finished either with a narrow edging of some sort (perhaps a simple picot or narrow lace), or many have a hem not quite an inch deep. Hemstitched edges are also pretty. The three pieces are placed on the bureau-top one inch apart.

Now, in regard to materials for making these three-piece sets: The most effective set I have so far seen was made of ecru scrim, hemstitched at the edges, and having a cross-stitch design in each corner done in colored linen thread. The design was a black basket (with high handle) filled with flowers of various delicate colors.  
Another dainty dresser set was made of ordinary cream linen hand-towel. It gave the effect of real linen, yet was inexpensive. The three pieces were bordered all around, just above a half-inch hem, by a strip of old-blue flowered cretonne; this cretonne band was one-half inch wide and was sewed flat on the goods. (Of course, the cretonne matched the window over-drapes, thus helping with the general color scheme of the bedroom.)  
Dotted Swiss (pieces from an old dress!) provided the material for still another three-piece dresser set which I have recently seen in a friend's home. This set, like all the others I have described, was made in the dimensions given above, but was finished with a border of pink French knots put on over the machine stitching around the hem. A small, solid flower made of French knots decorated each corner of the three pieces.
