BENSON BUCK, ELGINBURG, LOSES BIG BARN BY FIRE

Benson S. Buck, Elginburg, lost by fire on Thursday morning his fine large barn situated near the head of Loughboro Lake. Twenty head of cattle, a number of hogs, a team of horses, all his vehicles, farm implements, etc., were lost. Mr. Buck and family were in the city on a business trip when the fire occurred, and they have no idea of the cause of the disastrous blaze. The barn, which was one of the best in the county, was insured for \$3,000, while there was \$500 insurance on implements and \$1,500 on live stock.
