

> The Dairy Standards Act The provisions of the Dairy Standards Act are being generally observed and the result is shown in improved quality both of butter and cheese. The commercial requirements call for more attention to the packages, and all cheese before leaving a factory must be branded and stamped with the date on which it was made and the number of the vat in which it was made. The railways and steamship companies are now asking that the covers of the cheese boxes be nailed on firmly. This due to carelessness m the manufacture of boxes and covers which were turned out without being made to fit. Now it is up to the cheesemaker to make his cheese to fit the boxes exactly, in order to avoid loss. If the cheese is above the top of the box the cover becomes crushed in by the weight of the cheese piles or top of it. Nailing the cover on is approved by all buyers as well as by the transportation men
