Regular trips to Amherst Island will be started shortly, and the renewal of the summer schedule will be a real boon to the farmers there.

Inducted Into Charge.

In the Presbyterian church at Melrose on Tuesday, Rev. G. S. Wood, Foxboro, was inducted into the pastoral charge of Melrose, Lonsdale and Shannville.

Arnprior Industries Going.

All Arnprior's industries are now running full time, some of them at night, except the lumber mills, and the prospects are that they also will have a busy season.

To Distribute Spawn.

Some 150,000 bass spawn will be sent to Campbellford, to be placed in the Trent River at Crow, Cassidy and Bradley Bays. The same number of speckled trout spawn will also be distributed in the creeks in this district.

Fined For an Offence.

A resident of Camden township appeared before G. F. Rutan, police magistrate of Napanee, on April 25th, charged with a breach of the O. T. A. A fine of \$200 and costs was imposed. Provincial Officer D. B. Wagar laid the information.

Tearing Down Old Buildings

A great deal of interest is being taken in the work being carried on for the new bank of Montreal building at the market square corner. The protecting fence is completed now and the old buildings are being torn down at a great rate.

Fifty-eight Gallons Taken.

From a maple tree in his sugar bush which he has been testing, W. H. Landon, Gosford, has taken fifty-eight gallons of sap, equal to a little over two gallons of syrup, since April 11th, so the season, although late in starting, has been almost up to the average.

To Enlarge the Hotel.

Work has started in making improvements in the Thousand Island House at Alexandria Bay, which will open May 23rd. W. H. Warburton is planning a large addition this fall which will enlarge the accommodations with 112 new rooms of fire-proof construction and with bath.

To Install Gas Plant.

At a special meeting of the Belleville council a by-law was passed to issue debentures for \$15,000 for improvement to the civic gas plant. A new gasific system will be installed with the object of lowering the cost of producing gas.

Tax Collector Has Surplus.

A unique occurrence is announced in connection with the collection of taxes in Brighton township. One hundred and one dollars over the total of 1922 tax roll, has been collected through five per cent. being added to tax bills not paid by December 14th last.

Great Success in California.

Writing from California, Miss Mary Woodcock, sister of Miss Woodcock, Tweed, relates her recent visit to the ranch and cotton plantation of Peter Hott who formerly resided at Tweed. The writer describes Mr. Hott as a prosperous cotton grower who is well and favorably known at Calexico, Calif.

New School for Campbellford.

The members of the Campbellford Board of Education by a majority vote decided to accept the tender of Thomas Brown, a Toronto contractor whose figure was \$63,375 for the erection of a new high school. Mr. Brown formerly resided in Campbellford, and it was from him that the board purchased the property on which it is proposed to erect the new high school.

Election Registration.

It is expected that election registration will take place about the first week in June. According to the new election act a person who wishes to have his or her name added to the lists must make application in writing and then when the date for the placing of names on the list is announced, he must appear in person or else have some person present who can give good reasons why the name should be added.

Remains on the Way.

Adelaide Pringle, widow of the late Andrew Pringle, formerly of Napanee, died at Tisdale, Sask. Deceased was seventy-nine years of age and leaves two sons, Gibson, Vancouver, B.C., and Harry, Tisdale, Sask., also two daughters, Mrs. Hoare, Battle Creek, Mich., and Mrs. Geo. Lambert, Tisdale, Sask. A sister, Mrs. Amey, resides in Kingston. The remains are on the way to Napanee for interment.

Liquor Case Finally Settled.

Jacob Cantor was fined \$480 in United States court for transportation of 100 cases of whiskey on his high-powered motor boat, Jewel III. The boat, valued at \$1,500, and liquor were confiscated as the result of a spectacular waterfront raid at Alexandria Bay, N.Y., last summer by officials of the revenue cutter Chillochee.

Completing a Bust.

Miss Florence Kane, American sculptress, who is widely known in New York and Newport, is completing in her Paris studio a bust statue of James K. Hackett, noted Shakespearean actor, a native of Wolfe Island, and summer resident of the Thousand Islands. It is taken of him as he portrays the role of Macbeth, which he has been playing so successfully in Europe.

Spring Fishing.

Speckled trout season commences May 1st. The rivers and lakes will offer exceptional sport for the spring fisherman this year. Local conditions in the park reserve have induced the Canadian National Railway to open the outfitting store at Algonquin Park station May 1st. The Dairy Standards Act

The provisions of the Dairy Standards Act are being generally observed and the result is shown in improved quality both of butter and cheese. The commercial requirements call for more attention to the packages, and all cheese before leaving a factory must be branded and stamped with the date on which it was made and the number of the vat in which it was made. The railways and steamship companies are now asking that the covers of the cheese boxes be nailed on firmly. This due to carelessness in the manufacture of boxes and covers which were turned out without being made to fit. Now it is up to the cheesemaker to make his cheese to fit the boxes exactly, in order to avoid loss. If the cheese is above the top of the box the cover becomes crushed in by the weight of the cheese piles on top of it. Nailing the cover on is approved by all buyers as well as by the transportation men.
