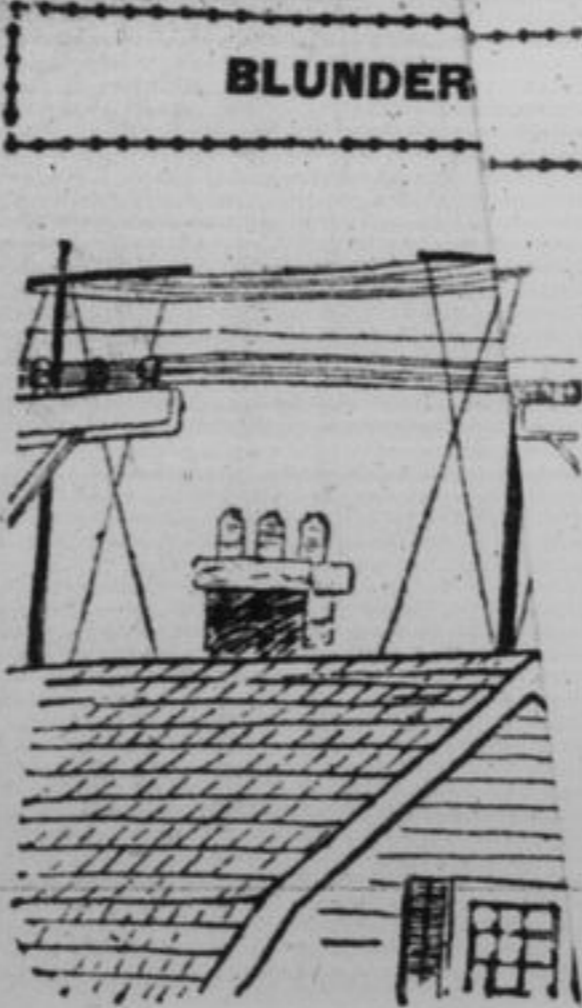

What the Press Agents Say About Coming Attractions

### BIG VAUDEVILLE BILL AT THE GRAND

Newspapers Speak Highly of Cultural Vaudeville Circuit.

Speaking of the Cultural Vaudeville Circle, which opens a week's engagement at the Grand Opera House to-night, the London Free Press says:

For a long time London citizens have been looking forward invitingly to what might be truly described as good vaudeville, and now it is here. It opened at the Grand theatre last night when the Cultural Vaudeville Circuit, composed of seven of the best acts touring the theatrical stage to-day commenced an engagement lasting for the remainder of the current week.

The headliner, and in this case he is a real realer, is Tameo Kajiyama, a son of the Flowery Kingdom, whose feats of mental simultaneism are unbelievable and utterly beyond the conception of anyone who fails to see his achievements, which might with truth be termed multiple concentration. His act is the quintessence of the excellent and marvelous and his audience sinks into a stage of ultra-admiration as his performance progresses.

Startling feats which in themselves are difficult for a man of ordinary intelligence, Tameo proceeds to give simultaneous exhibitions of applied concentration which if performed individually, would require marked skill and practice. He is nothing short of a wizard in his line and stands out in the vaudeville world as day stands out from night. The super vaudeville attractions which have come to London fade into the uttermost insignificance when compared with his mystifying performance, and when one has witnessed his act there is but one conclusion that can be arrived at, that he has half a dozen brains working at one and the same time on his many problems. The only attitude that can be taken by the audience is one of profound awe and amazement.

Tameo writes, reads, talks, answers questions and extracts the cubic roots of numbers running into the seven figures all at the same time. He does even more than that. This Japanese vaudeville star, having accepted four lengthy words suggested by members of the audience, he writes them simultaneously forwards, backwards, upside down and right side up, mingling the letters of each word in a methodical yet amazing manner in one continuous line. From this maze of alphabetical characters he separates the words until each stands out by itself bearing silent but eloquent testimony to the fact that the word "wizard" is entirely inadequate if one wants justly to describe his mental manipulations. To fully appreciate this act one must see the multitude of amazing complexities he performs with an unequalled skill and dexterity.

Second only to Tameo himself is the turn of the Beasley twins and Dan Caslar. This act, heralded as something out of the ordinary, in musical vaudeville attractions, more than lives up to all pre-performance announcements. The Beasley twins are, indeed, a versatile pair, as the classical numbers on the violin, characterized by an accuracy and precision, and latterly their singing, be-

### Property.

The Company owns in the Matachewan Gold Area approximately 840 acres in a compact block.
