NO LONGER NECESSARY TO SHIP FELDSPAR AWAY

Grinding Plant Now in Operation at Floor and Tile Company Plant.

Local industries are experiencing an increasing demand for their output and are planning extensions in order to be able to supply the demand. The Kingston Floor and Tile Company, which has been using feldspar mined in north Frontenac, has installed a grinding mill, so that it is no longer necessary to ship the rock away to have it pulverized. This work is now done at the local plant, and the material is used in the manufacture of surfaced tile, making most beautiful ornamental material. Mr. Townsend now reports that he has been obliged to double the capacity of his mill in order to meet orders from outside points, and the machinery is now being installed. One Hamilton firm will use 13,000 tons of this feldspar annually. The rock is brought to the city by the Canadian Pacific and shipped out by the Canadian National.
