Mr. Grant son of the late Principal George Runno Grant, is being honored by his alma mater in recognition of the valuable services he has performed in Canadian educational affairs. #### THE VOTERS' LISTS.

Revision in Kingston from June 5th to 9th.

The revision of the voters' lists to be used in the forthcoming provincial elections is to take place in the city from June 5th to the 9th inclusive. Judge Lavell and J. B. Walker will be the revising officers.

Judge Lavell will be the revising officer for Frontenac county and he will hold sittings at the following places: Wolfe Island, May 23rd; Sunbury, May 24th; Howe Island, May 25th; Harrowsmith, May 26th; Bartfield, May 28th; Cataraqui, June 1st; Fermoy, June 2nd; Sydenham, June 4th, and Portsmouth, June 11th.

The basis of the list will be Part I and Part III of last year's municipal lists.

There are no radical changes in the Ontario election act. The election board must approve the polling places, their number and the suitability of the building to be used. The sum of \$8 is allowed for each polling booth and the money is to be paid by the municipality, which will in due course be reimbursed by the government.
