Vanilla Crop Shows Decline. The season for vanilla in Guadeloupe is now closing, and the harvest is much less than was indicated by earlier estimates. As some 15,000 pounds already has been shipped and apparently little remains, it seems probable that the total crop will not exceed 30,000 pounds.

Chinese Building Activities. Shanghai general building and construction continues normal. Special activity is reported from Canton in the construction of low-priced dwellings, offices, schools and hospitals.

Hemp Crop in Philippines. Abaca (Manila hemp), though superseded by sugar in the list of Philippine exports since 1920, still holds the premier place among native industries, giving employment to many millions of people and affecting the purchasing power of the country more largely than any other raw material.

North Russia Exporting Meat. A newspaper despatch from Vardo, in North Norway, forwarded by Consul Irt, indicates that the food shortage in Northern Russia is no longer serious. The Soviet center Kominter arrived at Vardo recently with 5,000 kilograms of frozen reindeer meat, 17,000 partridges and 2,000 ptarmigans, which were offered for sale.

Important Consolidations Ahead. Arrangements are now under consideration in the Netherlands providing for the absorption of the Holland South African Lines by the United Netherlands Company. The completion of this deal depends upon the approval of the Government, which has heretofore granted subsidies to the latter company, the Amsterdam Rubber Company and the Netherlands Rubber Company are considering an amalgamation which would form the largest rubber company in the country.
