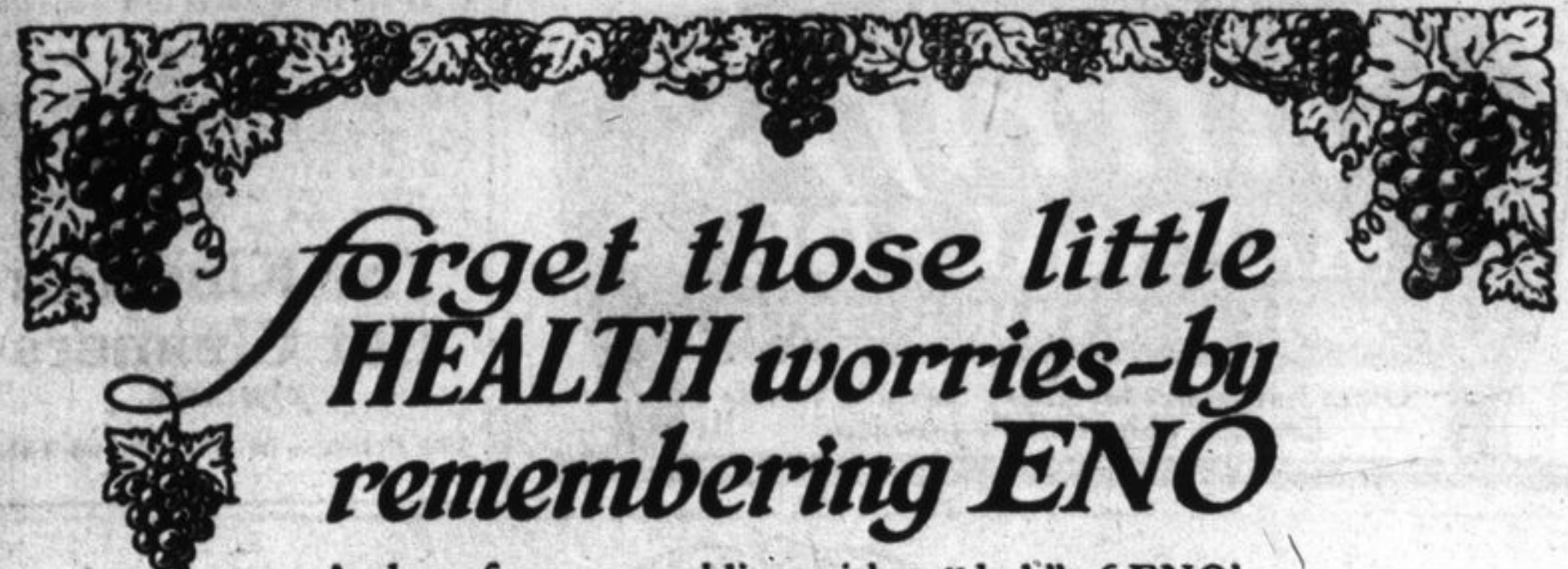
dent, is renewing acquaintances in town.
