# SHARBOT LAKE DOCTOR DIES VERY SUDDENLY

Found Dead in Bed in Prince George Hotel, Kingston, Friday Morning.

The death occurred very suddeny at the Prince George hotel, this tity, sometime during Thursday night of Dr. C. J. Parsons, a wellknown physician and resident of Sharbot Lake. The deceased was found dead in bed about 7 o'clock en Friday morning by one of the hotel employees, when he failed to resond to the usual early call. Medical aid was summoned at once, but it was found that life had been extinct for some time, death being due to

apoplexy. The late Dr. Parsons, although he had celebrated his seventy-fourth birthday on Friday last, had been in very good health until Thursday evening, when a local physician attended him for what was thought to be only an ordinary disability.

He had practised his profession for over forty years in the vicinity of Sharbot Lake, where he was highly esteemed and respected by all classes of the community. That he had been in good health is proven by the fact that he came to Kingston only eleven days ago to arrange a number of business matters preparatory to leaving for England to visit his peo-

Although born and educated England, his former home being in the county of Somerset, the late Dr. Parsons had lived in this country since young manhood, and was considered to be exceptionally well-informed in his profession. He was an Anglican in religion.

Surviving are his widow, and one sister, the latter being a resident of Somerset, Eng., and other more distant relatives all living in the Bri-
