## OWNS UP TO RECORD OF LURING GIRLS AWAY

**Italian Sentenced to Three Years in Prison, May Be Deported.**

Windsor, July 9.—Convicted of luring Bertha Carigan, eighteen years old, from her home at Lachine, Que., Vincent Dorega, forty years old, was sentenced to three years in penitentiary.

Dorega was arrested two weeks ago after the girl had been taken into custody by the police on a charge of vagrancy. She told the police she was to have been sent to a convent by her mother, but Dorega insisted on her going to Windsor with him. Dorega was married to her sister, she said.

The magistrate ordered an investigation as to whether Dorega is a Canadian citizen. If he is not, he will be deported to Italy, where he was born, on expiration of his sentence.
