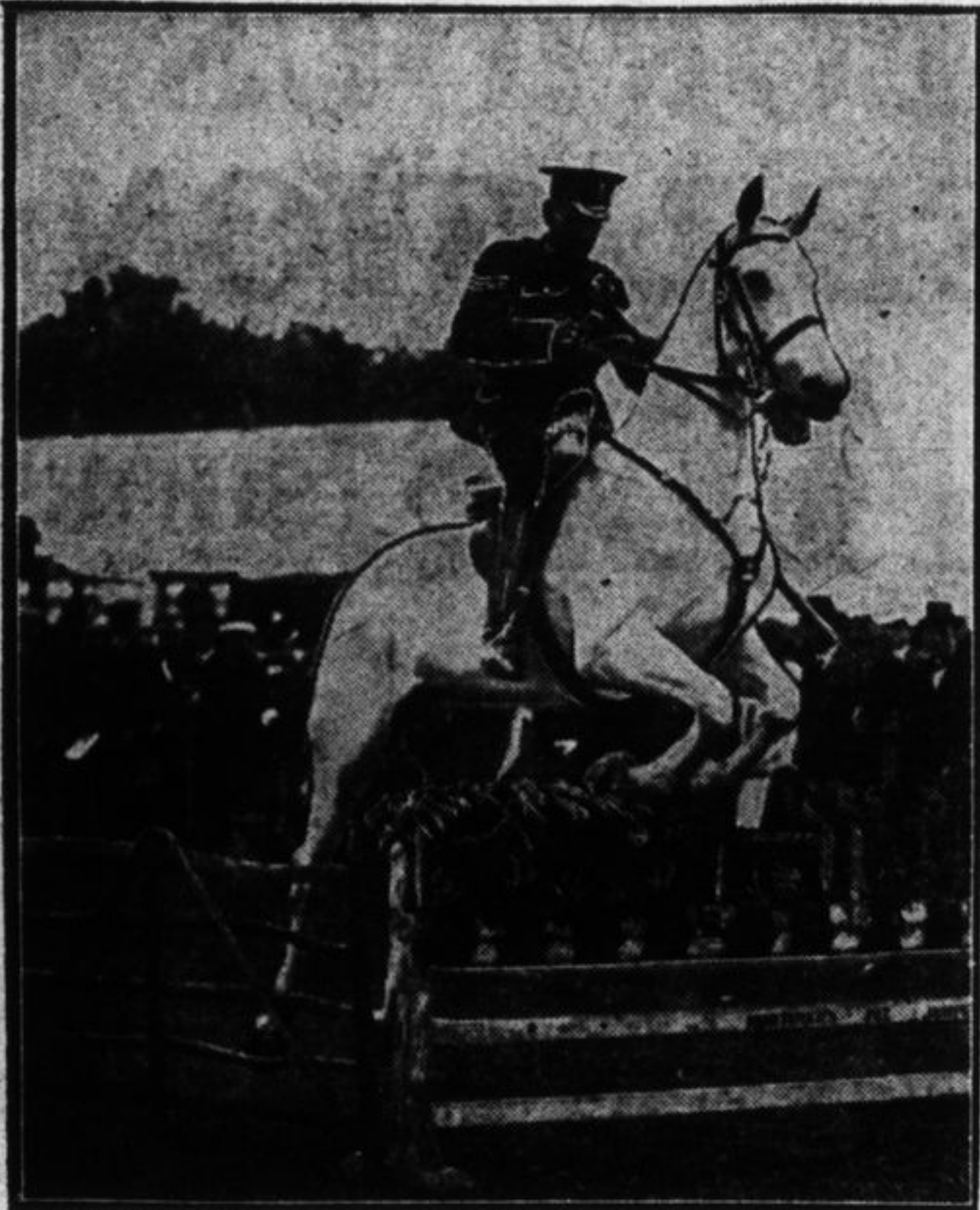


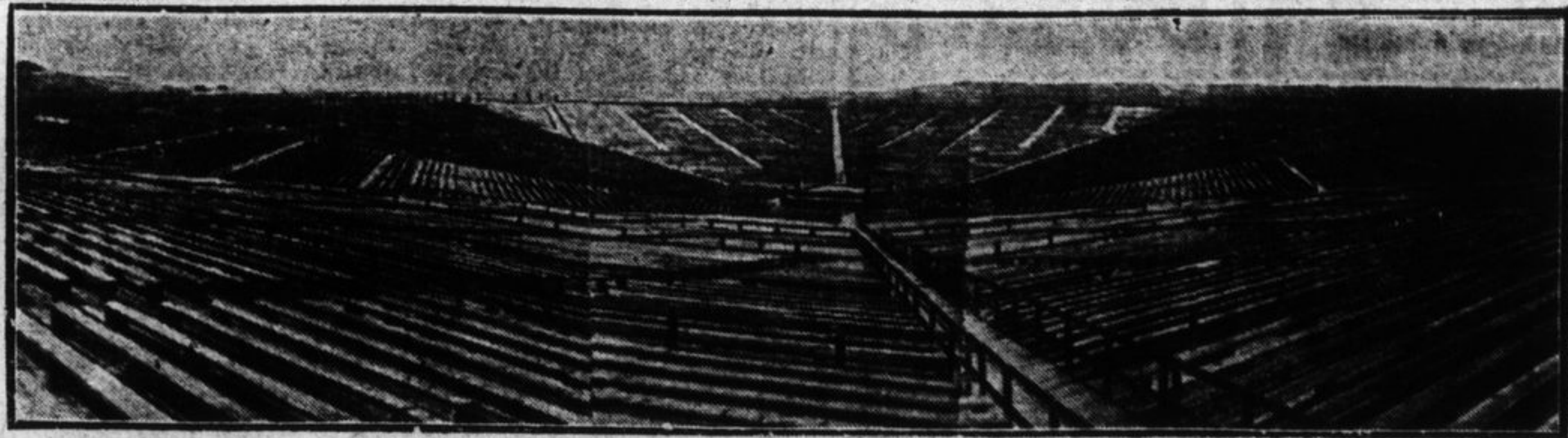

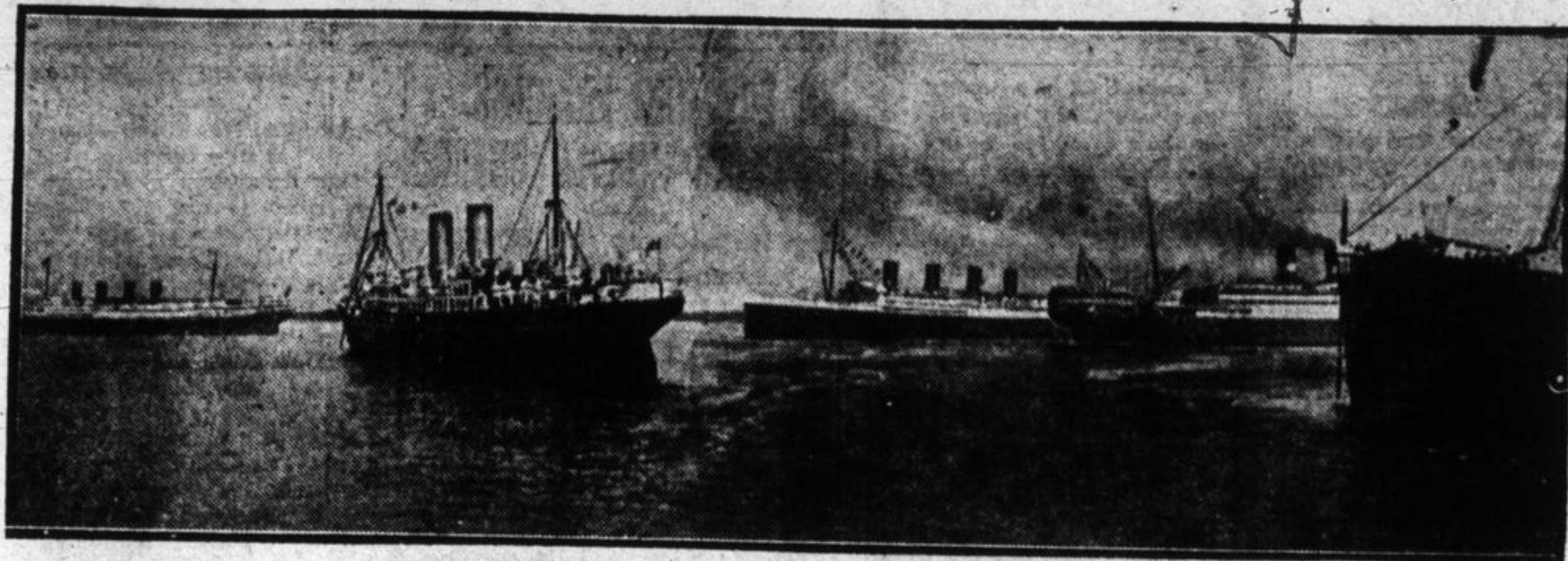
One of the competitors in the riding test for mounted police taking a hurdle at the Richmond Royal Horse Show, England.
