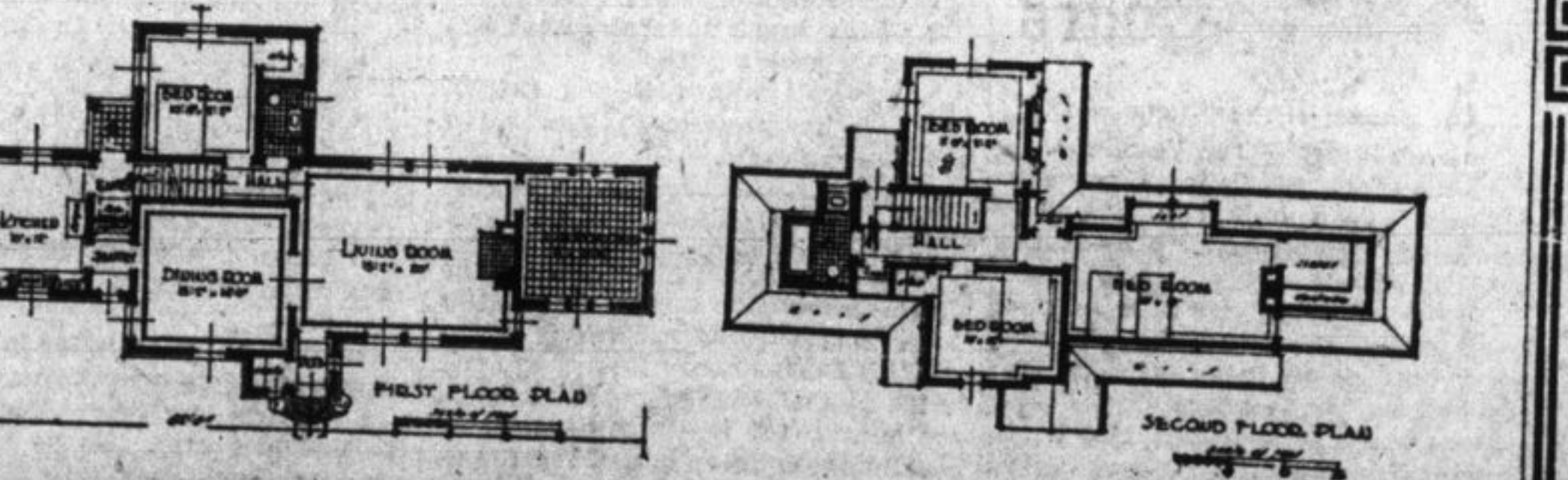
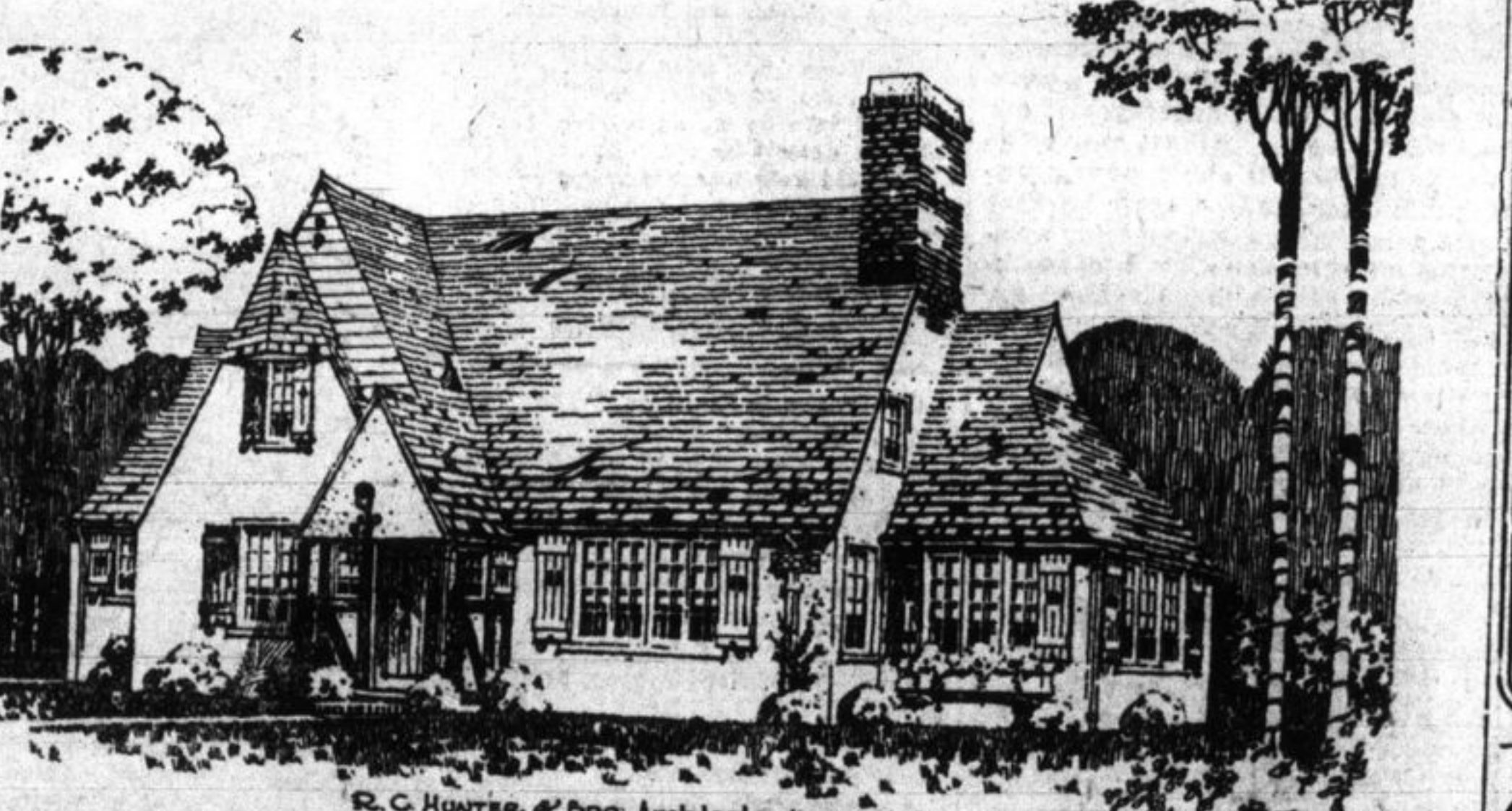

AN ENGLISH COTTAGE



For the lover of the English Cottage type of home (and what other type is so rich in artistic possibilities for the small house?) here is a house that appeals.

Nor does the appeal of this house lay in the charming exterior alone, the plan arrangement also offers its claim. It is an economical, practical layout, with decorating possibilities for homey livable interiors.

All of these factors are important ones, without them, no matter how pleasing may be the exterior, it cannot be a home in the real sense of the word.

One enters the house through a comfortable vestibule into the living-room. A coat closet opens from the vestibule.

The living-room is of good size. It has windows on three sides and opens into an enclosed Sun Porch. A small rear hall serves the stairway, the first floor bedroom and the toilet-room.

The rear entry, kitchen and pantry are arranged for convenience and comfort. Excellent light and ventilation are provided.

On the second floor one finds three bedrooms, a bath and plenty of closet space.

The exterior is of stucco finish on frame construction, the roof is slate, the chimney hard burned red brick.

All exposed timber work, front entrance door and such is hand adzed antique finish, the tone one finds in the old weathered timbers of English houses.

The window shutters should be stained to match the timber work. All windows are of the casement type, swinging out.

Cost about \$9,400.
