This air-propelling craft, photographed on its trial spin, is the outcome of this man's dream, after forty-nine years.

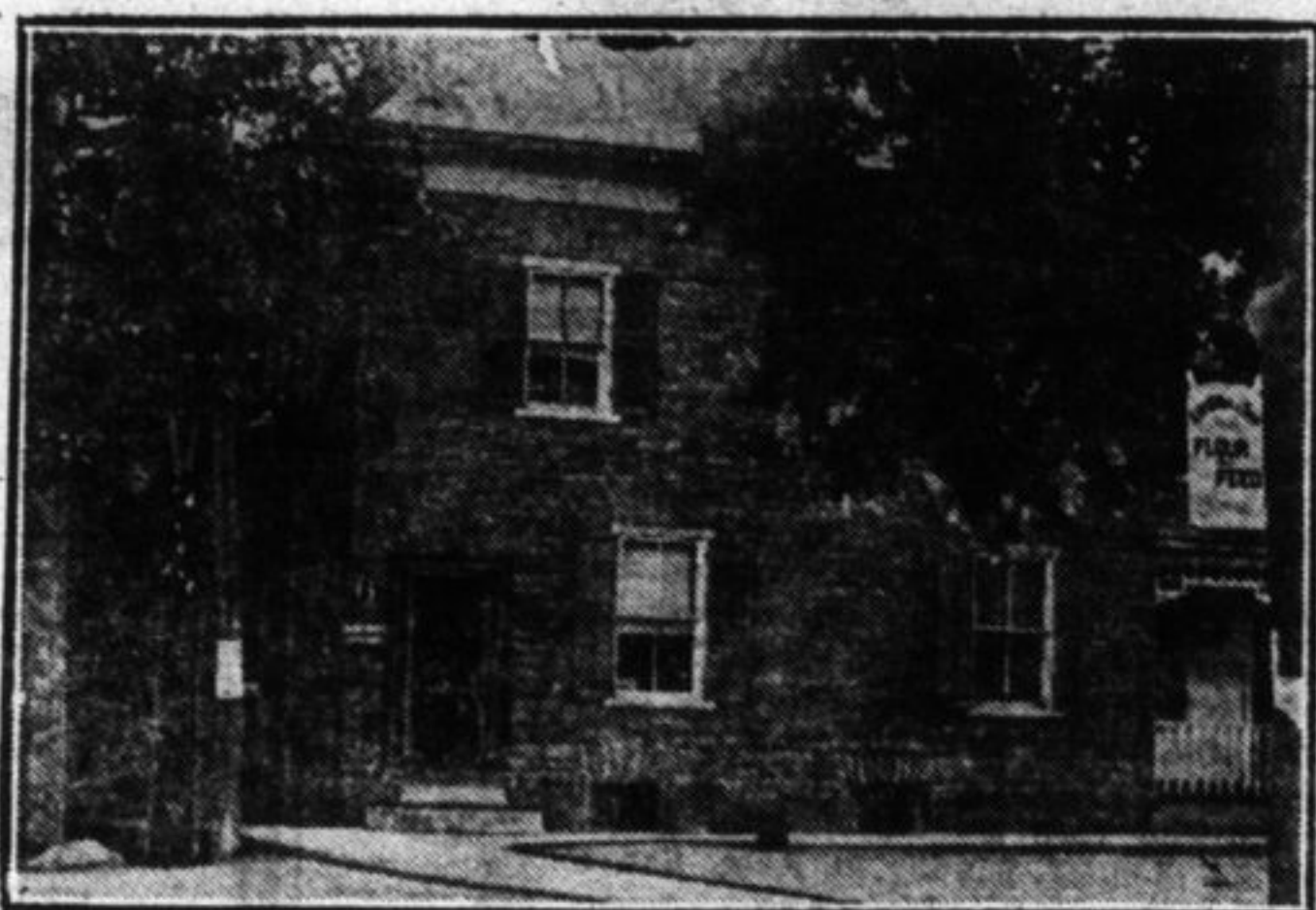


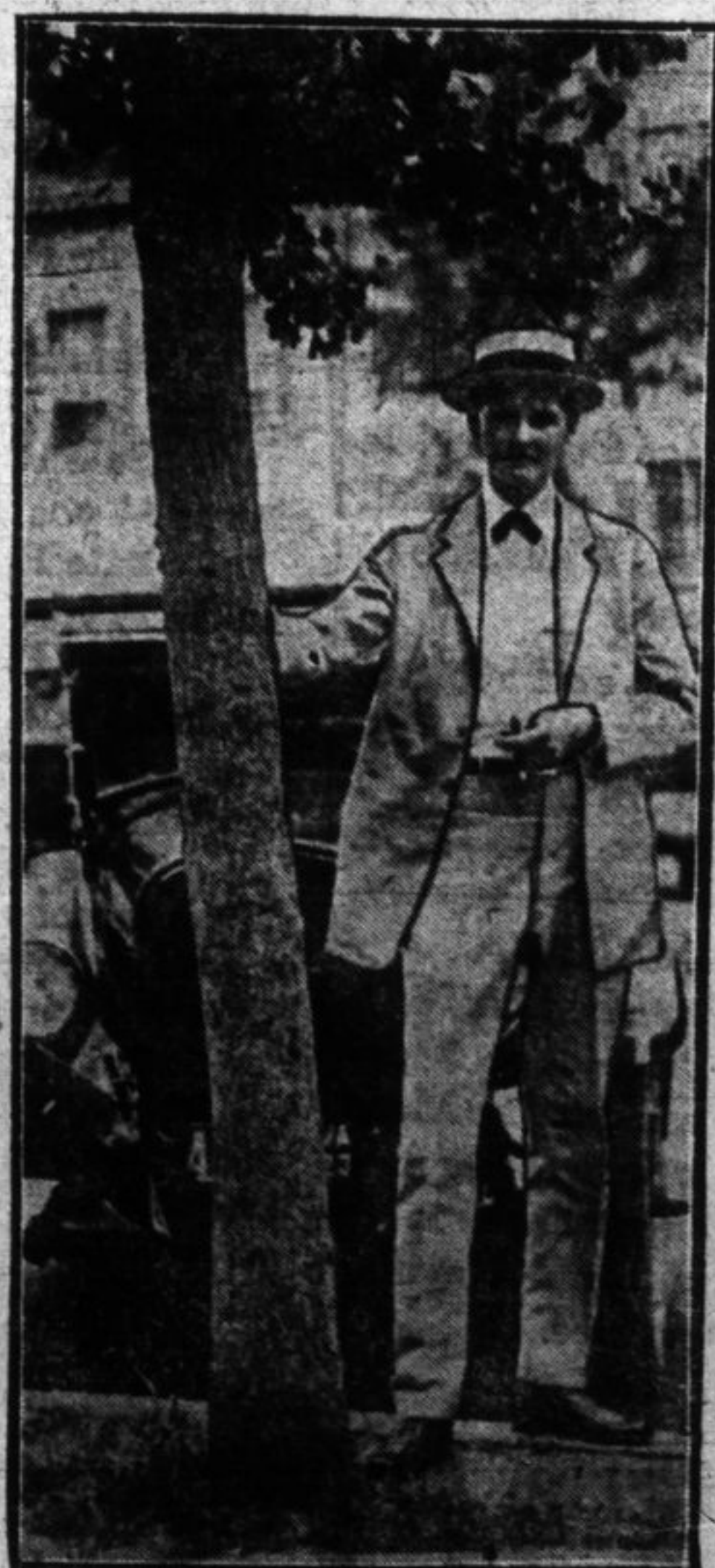
Photo shows the birth place of Premier-elect Howard Ferguson at Kemptville.

Gen. Pengalos, who commands the Greek army, is quoted as saying: "I have only to press a button and the whole Greek line will move against the Turks."



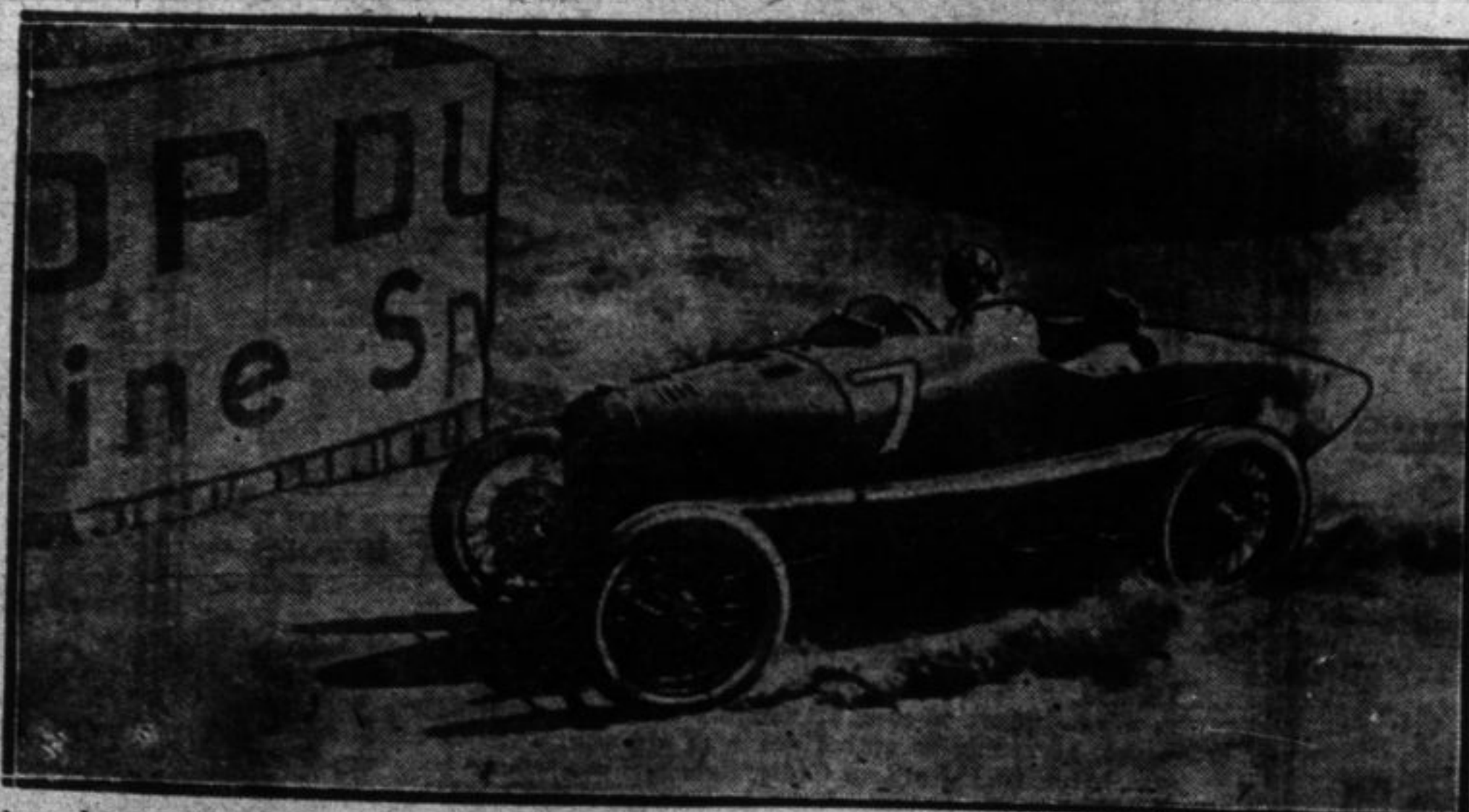
Clifford Lanham, superintendent of the tree department of the district of Columbia, has planted 105,000 shade trees in Washington in the last thirty years.
