

Blackberry Shortcake S. Smith: "Please tell me how to make Russian Dressing."

Answer: Mayonnaise salad dressing is the foundation for Russian Dressing. Any of the bottled commercial brands of Mayonnaise are good. Add to this Mayonnaise one tablespoon of tomato catsup, one tenspoon of Picalilli (or chopped green tomate or chopped green pepper may be substituted, instead), and one tablespoon of finely-minced raw onion. Chill and serve on crisp lettuce leaves. (This dressing is so rich and delicious in itself that it is generally served on plain lettuce or romaine-bardly ever on a fruit, vegetable, or meat salad.)

Beginner: "How are bananas

Enswer: Loosen the skin so that the fruit may be slipped out, but do not take it out until after baking. Bake for 30 minutes, remove skin, and cover with a sauce made by boliing one-balf cup of sugar and onehalf cup of water together for live minutes, then adding a teaspoon of butter and the juice of half a lemon. Camper: "What is a good game for a crowd to play when sitting around a camp fire?"

Answer: I know of nothing funnier than "Lecturing." In this game a subject, at random, is given to everybody in turn. And each person must lecture seriously on his particular subject. Sour Milk Spice Cake: Cream together one cup of sugar and one-half cup of butter. Add one slightly beaten egg, one cup of sour milk with one teaspoon of soda dissolved in it, two cups of flour sifted with one-half teaspoon each of salt, ground cloves and ground cinnamon, and, last, stir in one cup of large seedless raisins cut small. Turn the mixture into a buttered loafcake pan and bake 40 minutes in a medium oven.

White Cake Made With Sour Milk: Cream together one cup of sugar and one heaping tablespoon of butter. Add one cup of sour milk in which onehalf teaspoon of soda has been dissolved, one and two-thirds cups flour sifted with one teaspoon of baking powder, and last, fold in two stiffly-whipped egg-whites. Turn into a buttered pan and bake 45 minutes in a slow oven. (If a white cake is not desired, an ordinary yellow cake can be made by this recipe by using one whole egg (white and yolk) instead of the two egg-whites and no yolk, called for.)
