Stresemann Succeeds Cuno Who Resigned Owing to Want of Confidence Vote

Berlin, Aug. 13. -- Dr. Gustav Stresemann, new German chancelior, today undertook the task of organizing the ministry to replace the "cabinet of work" which Wilhelm Cuno brought into office last November and which passed out of existence yesterday, "in the face of a confidence vote" by the reichstag. The seriousness of the international situation with which the new chancellor is confronted is generally recognizod, for strikes are spreading, shortage of many of the necessaries of life is acute, and there is a growing tendency to disorder, arising from economic causes

Just what attitude the new chancellor will take towards "big business," now that he is installed as head of a socialistic-bourgeois cabinet, is a question which is already actively agitating the minds of the politicians. They recall that Chancellor Stresemann was wholly indebted to the influence and support of the industrialists for his political advancement.
