HAPPINESS THROUGH THRIFT WAS ADVICE OF HARDING

By S. W. Straus, President American Society for Thrift Of the many cherished words which a grieving nation today is recounting as a valued heritage from our late President, none perhaps are more typical of the man himself than his utterances urging the practice of thrift by his fellow countrymen.

President Harding was himself a man of thrift. He understood its values and practiced its virtues. His appreciation of it was outlined in the following words: "No habit is so easy to form, none so hard to break, as that of reckless spending. And on the other side, none is more certain to contribute to security and happiness than the habit of thrift."

Leaders of thought in our present day and in past generations have given expression in various terms to the value of thrift to the individual, but no one has left us a more lucid, common-sense appeal for thrift than these words from our late President.
