#### Brief Items of Interest Picked Up by the Whig Reporters.

C.C.C. moonlight to Clayton 7.30.  
At Brockville Cheese board, 2,746 boxes were sold at 21c.  
Dr. H. A. Boyce will resume his practice at one o'clock on Monday, August 27th.

At the Brockville fair races on Wednesday Fred Patch, driven by Mr. Whitney, got fifth place in the 2.20 class.  
The value of the Canadian National Exhibition is placed at \$11,000,000, made up of \$6,000,000 in buildings, and \$5,000,000 in grounds.  
Miss Fannie Horne, B.A., Wolfe Island, has been successful in obtaining her specialist certificate in art and has been engaged as Art teacher in Morrisburg high school.  
Fred, McIlquham, of this city, recently left for the west and is in charge of one of the grain elevators in Calgary. Mr. McIlquham has had much experience in grain handling.  
Archibald McNaughton, formerly auditor of the Kingston and Pembroke railway company and now of the Grand River railway company, Galt, is visiting in Kingston.  
Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto, has the largest and most costly building on any permanent fair grounds the world over — the Coliseum — which cost \$1,500,000 and has 8-1-4 acres under roof.  
Under the leadership of Prof. T. Rutledge, Queen's, the new tunnel, connecting the Douglas Library with Fleming Hall, has been completed in the record time of three weeks and a half. Only a small gang of men were engaged.

**UPPER SCHOOL RESULTS.**  
How Candidates from Kingston Collegiate Institute Stood.  
The results of the Upper school examinations have been mailed to Kingston Collegiate Institute candidates. There were 32 candidates, who wrote on a total of 183 papers, failing in 58, succeeding in 125, with honors in 54. The outstanding ones are Mary Rowland, with 5 firsts and 6 seconds out of eleven papers, and Eldon Boyd, with 1 first and 3 seconds, 4 thirds and 2 credits out of 10 papers. Miss Rowland did the five years' work in four years, while Eldon Boyd was promoted last September from Form III to Form V, omitting Form IV.

### FIRE PREVENTION WEEK.

Proclaimed By the Governor-General, October 7th to 13th.  
The governor-general has issued a proclamation setting aside the week of October 7th to 13th to be observed as fire prevention week, and urges a general inspection and clean-up of all fire hazards in dwellings, and their surroundings, all public buildings, stores, warehouses, factories, hotels, theatres, asylums, hospitals and all other institutional buildings. He also urges fire drills for schools, public institutions, factories and large stores so that all may be familiar with exits in case of fires.  
Fire prevention addresses are to be given by teachers and municipal officials in the schools, also by Boy Scout leaders to their patrols.
