


Three personal friends of the late President Harding, who attended his funeral at Marion, were Harvey S. Firestone, Henry Ford and Thomas A.




Much public interest is being shown in "Arctic," a husky brought back from Alaska by members of the Harding party. He is destined to become as famous as "Laddie Boy."

When the Hun planted mines in the North Sea he had little thought that they would later be used as letter boxes. This novelty container of mails is used on a Canadian Pacific liner.




Viscount Peel, secretary of state for India, inspected a caravan which has been specially built for the Maharajah of Gwalior. It will be used for touring and big game hunting.
