MANY REPORTS COME FROM DUBIOUS SOURCES

The Latest is That Trotsky Has Been Assassinated In Russia.

London, Sept. 11. — A Central News despatch from Berlin says it is reported from Moscow that Leon Trotsky, Russian Soviet war minister, has been assassinated. No details are given. There is no confirmation of the report.

Reports of the death by violence, or otherwise, of Premier Lenin, or War Minister Trotsky and other prominent members of the Russian Soviet government, have already been circulated, usually coming through dubious channels. Serious reports regarding the condition of Trotsky's health were current early this year, but news despatches since have shown his pursuing his usual activities.

NO MORE POSTAGE STAMPS.

To Be Accepted on Cheques, Receipts and Drafts.

Ottawa, Sept. 11. — After October 1st, postage stamps will not be accepted for the war duty on cheques, receipts and bank drafts. Furthermore, it is announced by the excise stamps department that the excise stamps for this purpose will not be sold at postoffices. This, it is contended, would lead to confusion, as postal matters might be mailed with excise stamps instead of with the correct postage stamps. The excise stamps are to be sold at banks, "and such other places as may be designated by the department of customs and excise." On money orders and postal notes the war tax will continue to be paid by affixing postage stamps.

Capture is Affected After Two Years' Chase

London, Ont., Sept. 11. — The perseverance of the inspection branch of the dominion postal service is no better exemplified than in the case of Frank N. Snyder of Gainesville, Mich., who, after a two years' chase, has been captured at Everett, Wash., and will be brought back to Ontario to face a charge of robbing a Hydro-electric car near Amherstburg of a mail sack containing between \$5,000 and \$7,000.
