Several Kingstonsians who have visited Prince Edward county during the past couple of weeks have taken advantage of the cheap tomatoes.

Will Oil the Roads.
The intention of the Ontario Highway department to give the roads in the Kingston district another coat of oil. The roads are being oiled twice a year. Thanks to the good work of P. J. Gates, Westbrooke, who is roadmaster on the provincial highway from Kingston for a distance of eight miles westward, the surface is not being allowed to get filled with holes. It is safe to say that the roads in the Kingston district are the best kept in the province.
