BIG LUMBER MILL DESTROYED BY FIRE

It Was Owned by Spanish Mills Limited at Cutler, in Algoma.

Sudbury, Sept. 20.—The large lumber mill of the Spanish Mills Limited at Cutler, in the Algoma district is reported to have caught fire at 4.30 o'clock this morning and to be practically a total loss.

The fire was still burning at noon. One man is missing and is believed to have been burned to death.

The damage may run well over one hundred thousand dollars and possibly twice that if the flames spread to the reserve lumber.
