The marriage is to take place the latter part of September.

Their 50th Anniversary. Mr. and Mrs. S. Tice, Belleville, celebrated the fifty-sixth anniversary of their married life. Both are in the best of health and Mr. Tice, in spite of his eighty years, attended to his business as usual, walking from the house, at 257 John street, to Front street, twice.

To Take Another Position. Miss M. E. Dennison, R.N., Carleton Place, has resigned the position of night superintendent of the Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto, to accept the position of instructor of nurses in that institution. Miss Dennison will have charge of about one hundred and fifty nurses-in-training.

Add 2,000 Women Voters. Brockville voters' list will contain some 2,000 additional names. It is estimated, as a result of the franchise being extended to the wives of men owning property and to the husbands of married women with similar qualifications. They will be qualified to vote at the December elections.

Gone to North Bay. M. Ostrander, formerly principal of the Deseronto public school, has accepted the position of principal of the King George public school at North Bay, at a salary of \$1,800 a year. Mr. Ostrander will remove his family to North Bay the last of this month. This school is considered to be one of the finest in the province.

Brockville Benefits. Brockville Public Utilities Commission has announced a reduction of from \$2.99 per 1,000 cubic feet to \$1.80 for gas, to become effective Nov. 1st, and a reduction of ten per cent in the water rates, operative beginning Oct. 1st. A substantial reduction in the electric light and power rates will be announced within a few days.

Had A Narrow Escape. At Trenton, on Sept. 19th, nineteen-year-old Maude Edison narrowly escaped death when a runaway team and wagon crashed into C. P. Youre's home on Murphy street. The child was playing in front of the house and ran for safety, barely reaching the verandah when the horses and wagon dashed across the sidewalk into the house.

Ball is Granted. Judge Reynolds, Brockville, heard a request for bail for Andrew Harney, charged with manslaughter in connection with the death at Crosby, some weeks ago, of John Sherwood. The order was granted for \$1,000 by the accused himself and a surety for \$1,000, the ball to be subject to the approval of County Crown Attorney M. M. Brown, when furnished.

It Rained Too Early. Although the weather was far from inviting on Friday morning, from the standpoint of the fair directors, at least, the insurance company

holding the risk of the exhibition against rain was fortunate enough to save paying out any loss due as a result. The policy of the fair specifies the time between 8 o'clock in the morning and 8 o'clock in the evening of each day and although it rained hard during the early morning the loss, if any, could not be made good under the terms.

Domestic Lighting. Kingston pays the highest rate for domestic lighting of any city in Ontario. The figures are: St. Catharines, 1.3 cents per kilowatt hour; Ottawa, 1.4; Welland, 1.4; Niagara Falls, 1.5; Kitchener, 1.7; Stratford, 1.7; London, 1.8; Brantford, 1.9; Hamilton, 1.9; Woodstock, 2.0; St. Thomas, 2.1; Toronto, 2.1; Guelph, 2.5; Windsor, 2.6; Peterboro, 2.8; Sarnia, 3.0; Chatham, 3.1; Owen Sound, 3.3; Kingston, 4.0.

Activities of Non-Unionists. An animated discussion took place in the Glengarry Presbytery on the activities of ministers opposed to the consummation of church union, who have been pursuing the agitation with little regard to the accepted regulations of the church. It was intimated that one minister, belonging to another presbytery, had sent announcement of meeting within the bounds of the presbytery of Glengarry, and even taken the use of a church, without asking leave of the session concerned, or even giving them notice of his intention.

Cox-Talcott Wedding. A pretty wedding was quietly solemnized on Sept. 17th, when Mrs. Charlotte Carson-Talcott, "Towhara", Bloomfield, was married to William Wason Cox, Honeye Falls, N. Y., according to the simple and ancient order of the Society of Friends. The bride was gowned in pearl grey satin crepe and georgette, embroidered in steel. She wore a strand of Roman pearls. The bride's travelling dress was of navy blue pique tulle, embroidered in pearl grey and black, with a cape of black Duchess silk lined with cream satin, and a collar of Oriental embroidery, and hat of black silk velvet lined with pink crepe. Mr. and Mrs. Cox left by motor for the west, and will reside at "Content", Honeye Falls, N. Y., for the winter months.
