**Increased the Salary.**  
 The official board of Norfolk street Methodist church, Guelph, a few days ago added \$200 to the salary of their pastor, Rev. Henry Irvine, making the salary \$2,500 a year. Mr. Irvine was formerly of Kingston, entering the ministry from here.

**Give Good Details.**  
 Mrs. A. F. Chown, University avenue has received Japanese papers from her daughter, Mrs. Woods-worth, who lives at Kobe, and came safely through the recent earthquake. The papers, in English, contain very interesting details of the great catastrophe.

**Fruit Pedlars.**  
 Police Magistrate Rutlan, Napanee, has decided in a case against Sidney Lucas that the peddling of fruit throughout the country by a person other than the producer thereof without a county license, is a breach of the county by-law relating to hawkers and pedlars.

**Magedoma in Winter Quarters.**  
 The palatial steam yacht Magedoma, owned by the Fulford estate of Brockville, has gone into winter quarters at Tunnel Bay. The Magedoma is the largest steam yacht on the St. Lawrence, being built for ocean cruising, but seldom leaves the river. Her hauling port is London Eng.

**Former Student Pays Visit.**  
 William White, Chicago, a former student of the Ontario School for the Deaf and a printer by occupation, is spending a vacation in Belleville. Mr. White, employed as a compositor at the Ontario for seven years, is now engaged at that work in Chicago, having been a printer for forty-one years.

**Was A Record Event.**  
 Madoc Agricultural fair was held on Tuesday and Wednesday. The attendance was large. It was one of the best fairs ever held in the village. The grounds are well adapted for the holding of a fair and are being improved every year. The exhibits were varied and of an extensive nature. In all of the classes the entries were more numerous than in former years, and when placed in position presented an attractive appearance. W. J. Hill, the energetic secretary was a busy man.

**A Drowning Accident.**  
 A sad accident occurred at Carleton Place when David George Warren, second son of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Warren, lost his life in the waters of the Mississippi at the Bates & Innes bridge. The little fellow, in his ninth year, was playing with Jack Parker, both boys being on the timbers above the stop-logs on the new Bates & Innes bridge, when the Warren boy lost his balance and fell into the deep water above the dam. He was dead when pulled from the water.

**Heavy Cheese Production.**  
 The cheese production of eastern Ontario is likely to equal, if not exceed, that of last year, according to reports from dairymen. There was a perceptible improvement about the 1st of September following the decline in August due to the prevailing drought. Farmers are disposed to look to the cheese industry as a permanent source of income and there is general satisfaction over the ruling prices throughout the season.

**St. Lawrence Club Founded.**  
 Papers of incorporation for what shall be tentatively called the St. Lawrence Club, Inc., were filed with the secretary of state by A. T. Matthews, a prominent Watertown insurance man. The capitalization is \$1,000,000. The St. Lawrence Club will be on the site of the old Mamant hotel, which caps the top of a bluff

at Clayton, majestically rearing its mighty head above the waters of the St. Lawrence and occupying the most prominent position on the river for miles around.

**Retailers to Meet.**  
 The retail merchants association is to meet at the Board of Trade rooms next week for the purpose of dealing with several questions that are of very great interest to retailers. W. Y. Mills, president, who has given much time to business of the local organization, is sending out the notices to the representatives of the different sections.

**Eleven Months Ill; Dies Suddenly.**  
 Following an illness of eleven months, death came suddenly to Sister St. Alban on Wednesday in the Pembroke General Hospital. The late Sister St. Alban (nee Catherine McCarthy) was in her fifty-first year. She was born and educated in Pembroke, later entering the Order of the Grey Nuns of the Cross. For many years she was attached to the staff of the Convent of Mary Immaculate, Pembroke, as assistant mistress of boarders. She is survived by one sister, Sister Sylvester, of the Order of Loretto, Loretto Abbey, Toronto.

**Died in Winnipeg.**  
 Miss Agnes L. C. Peters, passed away at Winnipeg on Sept. 21st.

Deceased was a daughter of the late Solomon Peters, formerly of Newburgh. In her early life she learned the art of dressmaking from Miss Tait, Napanee, after which she followed her trade for a number of years. Miss Peters then accepted a position as head saleslady in the mantle department of the T. Eaton Co., Winnipeg. About a year ago she had a slight stroke, which was followed by another. The funeral took place in Winnipeg.

The Anneka Jans Bogardus Estate. James Maxwell, 17 Victoria street, chairman of the Kingston association of Anneka Jans Bogardus heirs, is in receipt of an affidavit made by William Weiber Easton, Toronto, in the matter of the estate of Wolfert Webber, which throws much light on the mystifying case that has aroused the intense interest of thousands of persons who trace their descent from Anneka Jans Bogardus. Mr. Easton claims to be a direct descendant. He says that within the past six months an heir residing in Michigan has been approached by people "who offered him money for his influence in side-tracking the efforts of the heirs to obtain that to which they are entitled." Mr. Easton says that he has interviewed nearly five hundred descendants and found that none had pursued their investigations to the same extent as he has done.
