THE POLICE UNEARTH A 1,000-GALLON STILL

Most Important Seizure in Hastings County Annals Made Saturday.

Belleville, Oct. 16.—At the end of a path in the thick woods on the farm of Joseph Chappelle, north of Tweed in the township of Hungerford, was found on Saturday afternoon one of the largest stills ever discovered in the county of Hastings. Fifteen gallons a day of October distillation is the estimated capacity of the still.

Dublin, Oct. 16.—Labor and financial questions have recently overshadowed the political trouble with the republicans, but this trouble is not at an end. The republicans dispute the release from prison by saying that the government statistics of the releases are illusory, adding: "In many cases the new arrests exceed the number of those released, and the overcrowding of the prisons is greater than before."

ZANOWILL SEES JEWISH STATE AS A LOST HOPE

Author and Publicist Makes Charge of "Political Mishandling" by England.

New York, Oct. 16.—The forces of Israel must mobilize against another war and rather than "throw a match into such a powder factory as the globe has become," forego their political hopes in Palestine, it was declared last night by Israel Zangwill, Jewish author and publicist who spoke before the American Jewish Congress in Carnegie Hall. He arrived from England recently.

"There was a moment when a Jewish state might have arisen in Palestine," he said, "but the hour of destiny has passed."
