Want Larger Quarters.
The Frontenac Council, Knights of Columbus is discussing the question of acquiring a larger building. The present club quarters at the corner of King and Union streets have become too small. It is possible that the Knights may erect a new building.

Belleville Jail Report.
Governor Ketcheson, of Belleville, and Hastings county jail, in his report on the institution, states that the actual cost for food supplied the inmates for the yearly period was 17.92 cents per day for each prisoner. During the year some 250 inmates were in the institution.

Another Point of Interest.
The new memorial arch at the entrance to the Royal Military College will be one of the most interesting of the many sights for tourists from all parts of the world. Each year the Point Frederick college is becoming more and more of a historical museum in itself.

Much Road Work Done.
The Board of Works Department is completing a very busy season of road work. A large amount of permanent paving has been done since last spring. Kingston now has over eleven miles of roads permanently paved and five miles of oiled roads. Probably no place the size of Kingston can equal this.

Students to Parade.
A students' parade will be staged on Friday as a send-off to the Queen's team and rosters on the noon train. The parade will proceed from the University grounds at 12.30 o'clock, headed by the band, and will pass along Barrie, down Princess, and then to the Johnson street station. It is estimated that over a thousand local supporters will go to Toronto for the big game.

Heard to Advantage.
At a district gathering of Rotarians at Peterboro on Monday, Anthony Thorpe, of the R. C. H. A. Band, Kingston, and formerly of

the British symphony orchestra, was heard to splendid advantage in a trombone solo, in which he demonstrated his absolute mastery of his difficult instrument, and his masterly playing was so enthusiastically applauded that an encore had to be given.

Adds to Property.
W. H. Warburton, proprietor of the Thousand Island House at Alexandria Bay, has added to his holdings there by purchasing from the Boldt estate what is known as "The Nut Shell" adjoining the hotel. It is planned to erect two bungalows on this land and to build an overhead bridge to Casino Island, where tennis courts will be laid out and a fire-proof moving picture theatre with seating capacity of 500 erected. Vaudeville entertainments will also be given in this theatre.
