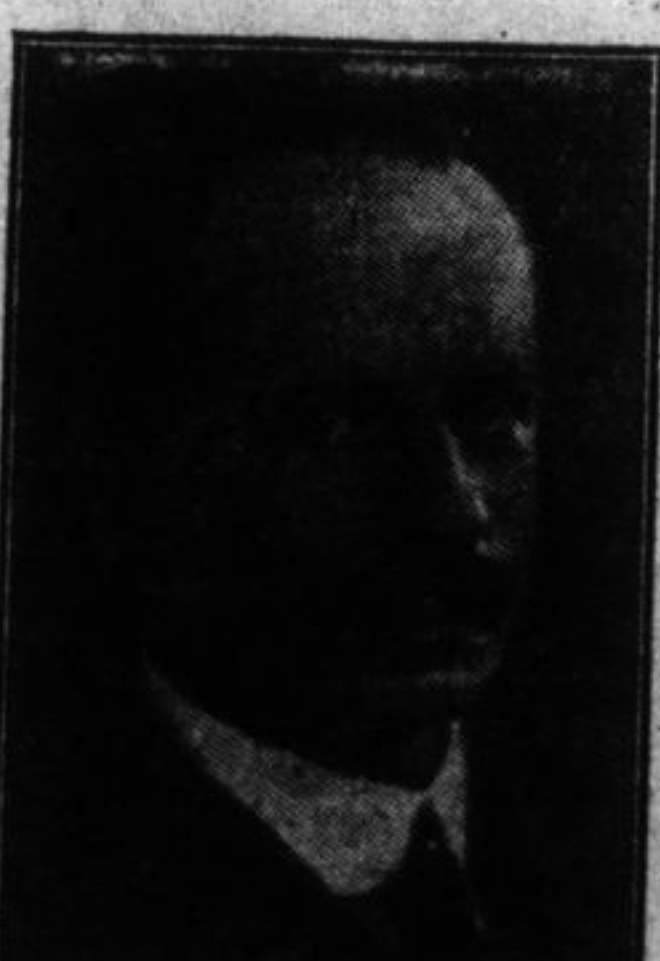
Water Report.

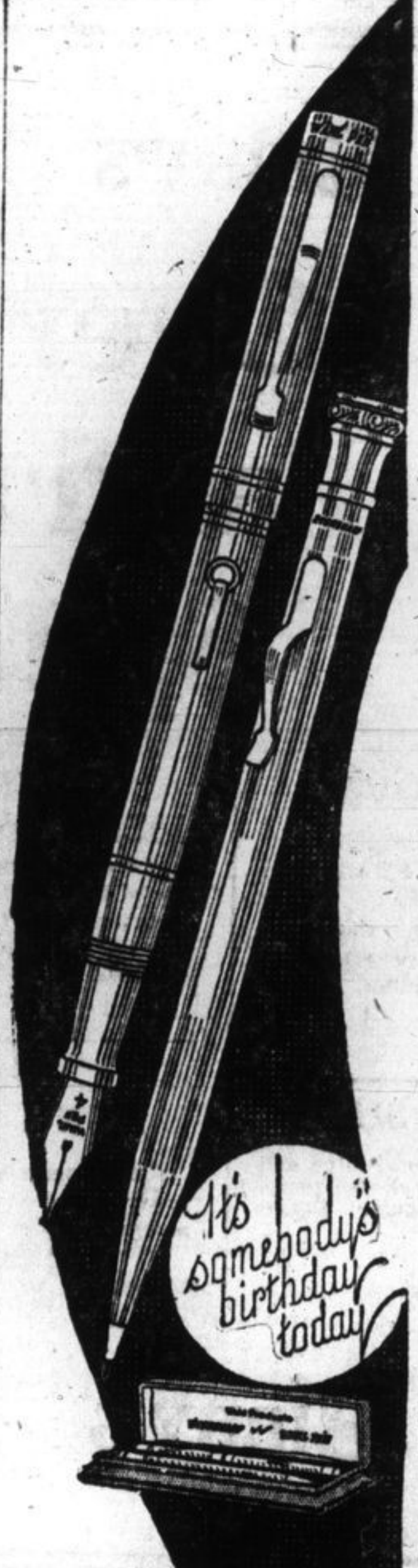
