Designation of the apartment house created in Broad street, Brockville, by R. H. Smart as "The Malloch Apartments" is an appropriate tribute to the original owner of the building and long its occupant, his honor George Malloch, judge of the county court of Leeds and Greenville, and for many years a leading figure in the public life of this section of Ontario. Judge Malloch passed away on February 12th, 1917, at the age of seventy-two, the possessor of considerable wealth.
