COVER FIELD WITH STRAW

It is a well known fact in Kingston that the Queen's players perform better on a dry field, and for that reason the Queen's Athletic Board of Control intends to protect the playing field against wet weather.

A quantity of straw has been purchased, and it is the intention of the men in charge of the stadium to cover the playing field with straw on Tuesday afternoon or Wednesday at the latest.

On Tuesday morning, J. S. McDonald, secretary-treasurer of the Athletic Board of Control, when asked if Queen's won from Tigers on Saturday next would the Dominion championship game be played in Kingston, stated that the matter had not been decided.
