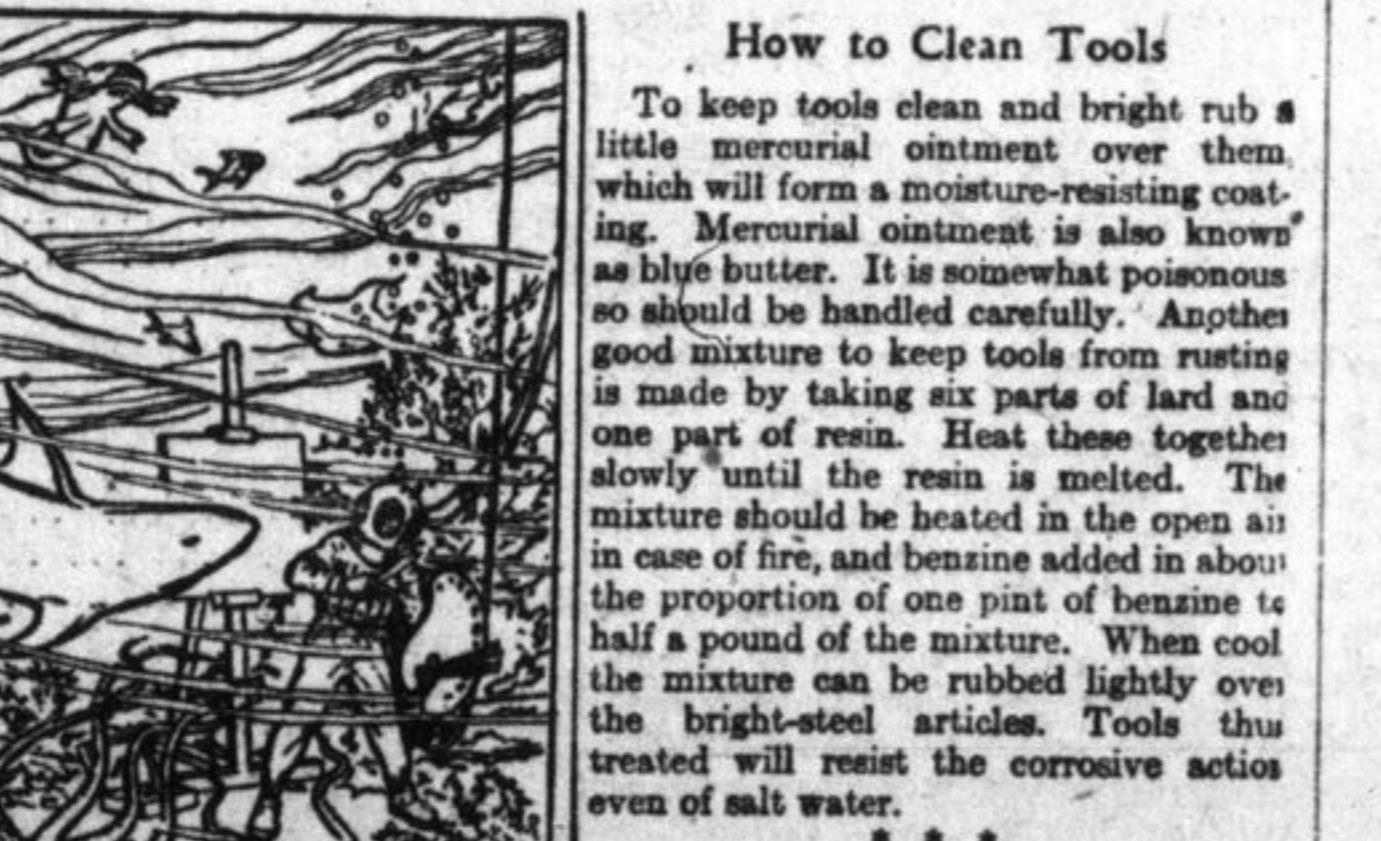
Hunters Snowshoe Over Mud to Stalk Sea Game

Skins and snowshoes are used by fishermen and hunters on the islands of the North Sea to enable them to walk over the wet and slippery mud that covers the ground most of the year.

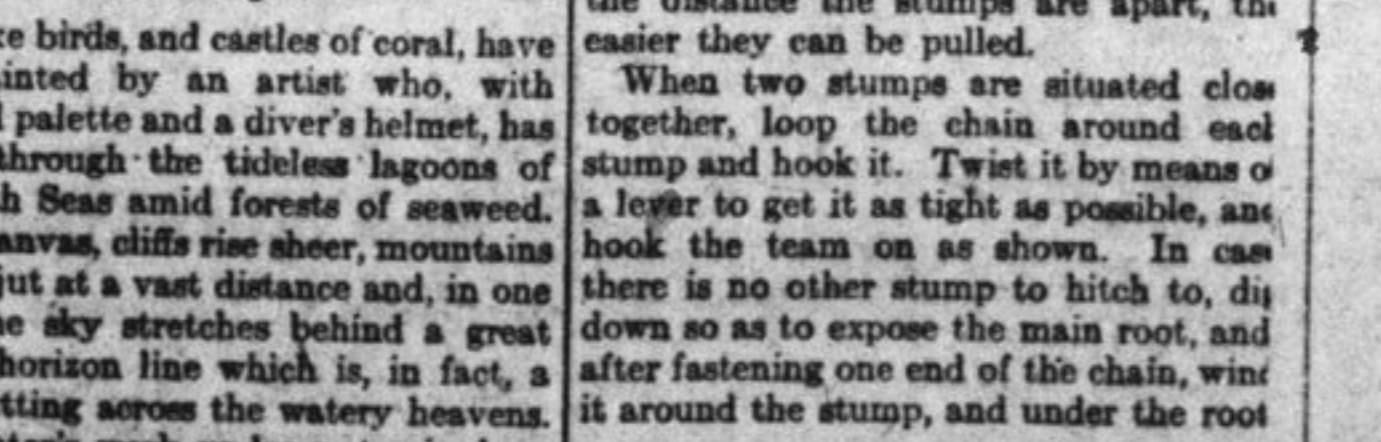


Impassable. First the natives strapped big wood boards to their feet, but later it was found that the footgear used to traverse the snowdrifts was more efficient.
