WESTERN TURKEYS COMING TO TORONTO

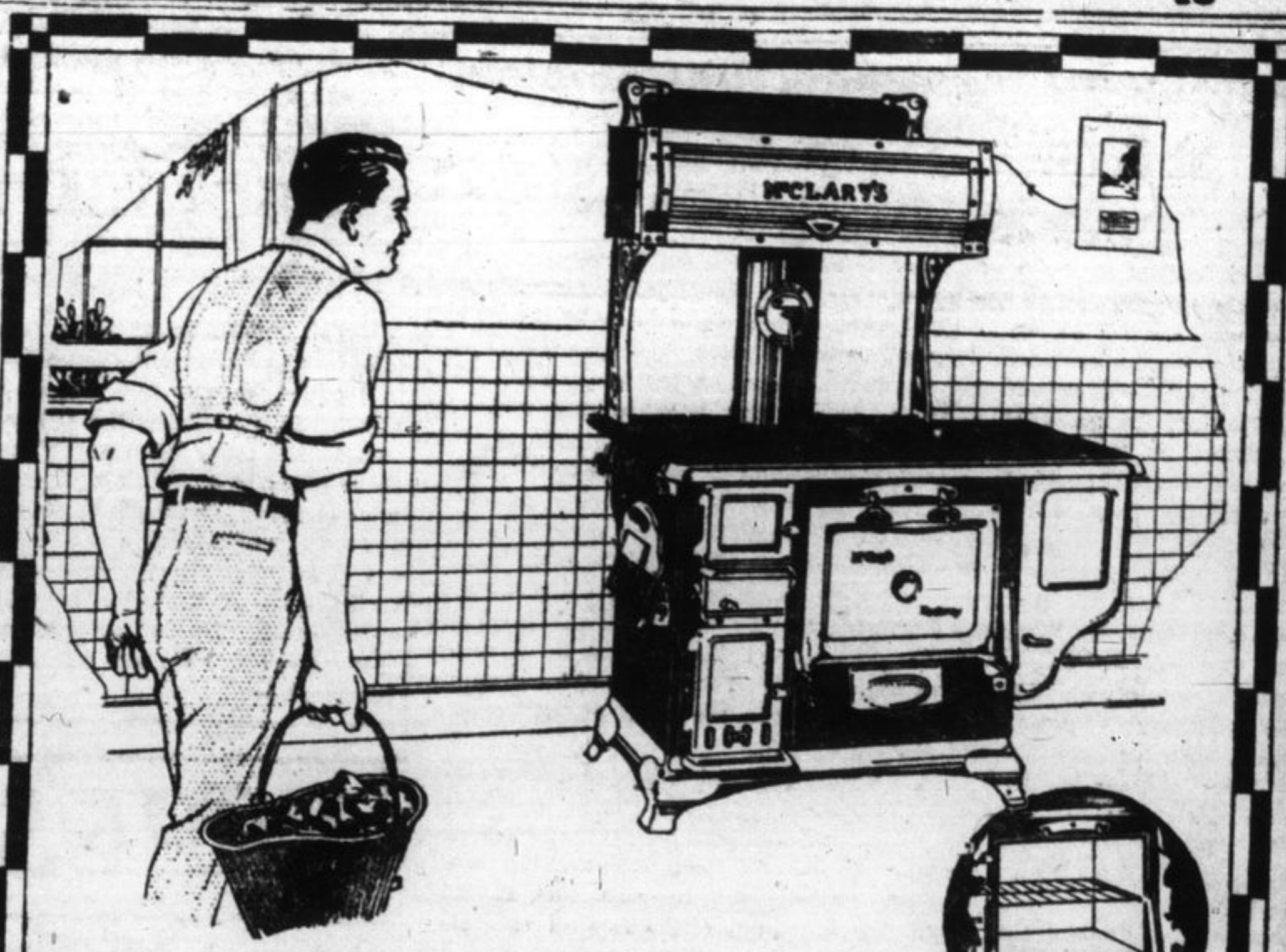
Still Many Turkeys of Last Year in Cold Storage Plants.

Edmonton, Nov. 23.—Real live Christmas turkeys, which gobbled, strutted and in general comported themselves as turkeys do, upon a hundred farmssteads in the Lake Saskatchewan district, north of here, are destined to find a last resting place amid floral tributes of cranberries upon the plates of Toronto citizens when December 25th rolls around.

Two car loads of live gobblers, shipped under the auspices of the egg and poultry marketing services of the Dominion and Provincial Governments, will leave Lake Saskatchewan in two weeks' time on their first and last sight-seeing trip.

In specially equipped cars, with ample feed and water enroute, the turkeys will not only reach the Toronto market alive and well but will probably have gained weight on the trip.

It is stated that owing to the glut of turkeys on the Canadian market last Christmas, due in part to the importation of turkeys from New Zealand, large quantities of last year's birds still remain in cold storage. One local man, well informed as to market conditions, states that there are a million pounds of last year's turkeys in various Canadian cold storage plants and five million pounds in American cold storage plants.
