The Destruction of Marash. -Marash, Turkey, the home of Miss Poladian, who speaks here on Sunday, was occupied by British Indian forces at the end of the World War. During their stay excellent order was maintained, but when French forces relieved them disturbances began. The ill-advised French Commandant threatened the Turks with bombardment if they hoisted their flag as they had been privileged to do under the British. They flew the flag and his guns opened up, but heavy rifle fire soon drove his forces to the shelter of the grounds of the Girls' College. Here they were practically prisoners, and starvation was at hand. Disguised runners were sent out to the nearest French regiments, a hundred miles away, but an aeroplane returned with the answer that neither forces nor provisions could be spared. FIRST MEERSCHAUM PIPE.

Made Its Initial Appearance Two Hundred Years Ago. Smokers will be interested to know that the bi-centenary of the meerschaum fall this year, as it was in 1723 that it made its first appearance.

The honor of discovering it is ascribed to a Hungarian shoemaker, who was also a clever carver in wood and other material. His excellence in this direction brought him under the notice of Count Andrassy, who gave him a piece of whitish clay, which he had brought from Turkey tto carve. Finding that it was porous, it occurred to the shoemaker that it might be good for making pipes as it would absorb the

He made one merely as an experiment, and found that it was all he had imagined. Thus the meerschaum came into being. This first meerschaum, by the way, is still preserved in the museum at Pesth.


