Jelly Doughnuts from Salem, Mass. (Miss O. S. A. sends us the following recipe, which she secured from her grandmother, a fine old New England

kousewife) 4 tablespoonfuls melted Crisco cupful sugar yeast cake

teaspoonful ground nutmeg cupful warm water 5 teacupfuls flour cald milk, then add melted Crisco. Dissolve yeast cake in warm water, add to milk when it has cooled. Then add sugar, salt and nutmeg. Mix thoroughly and stir in teacupfuls flour. Let rise over

In the morning knead as for bread, in rounds with a large biscuit cutter. Lay out on floured board fat enough apart to prevent sticking together when they rise. Let Fry in hot Crisco. Keep turning them until they are risen to a round ball. When partly cold make a small opening in the side with a knife and insert a teaspoon-ful of currant jelly. Dust with
