LEAGUE TO DECIDE UPON OWNERSHIP OF WRANGEL

Question Having Been Raised Must Be Referred to International Tribunal.

Ottawa, Dec. 10 .- At the next assembly of the League of Nations it is probable that a question of deep interest to this Dominion will be considered. It was made known here tonight that the question of Wrangel Island in all likelihood will be submitted to that court for

final settlement.
