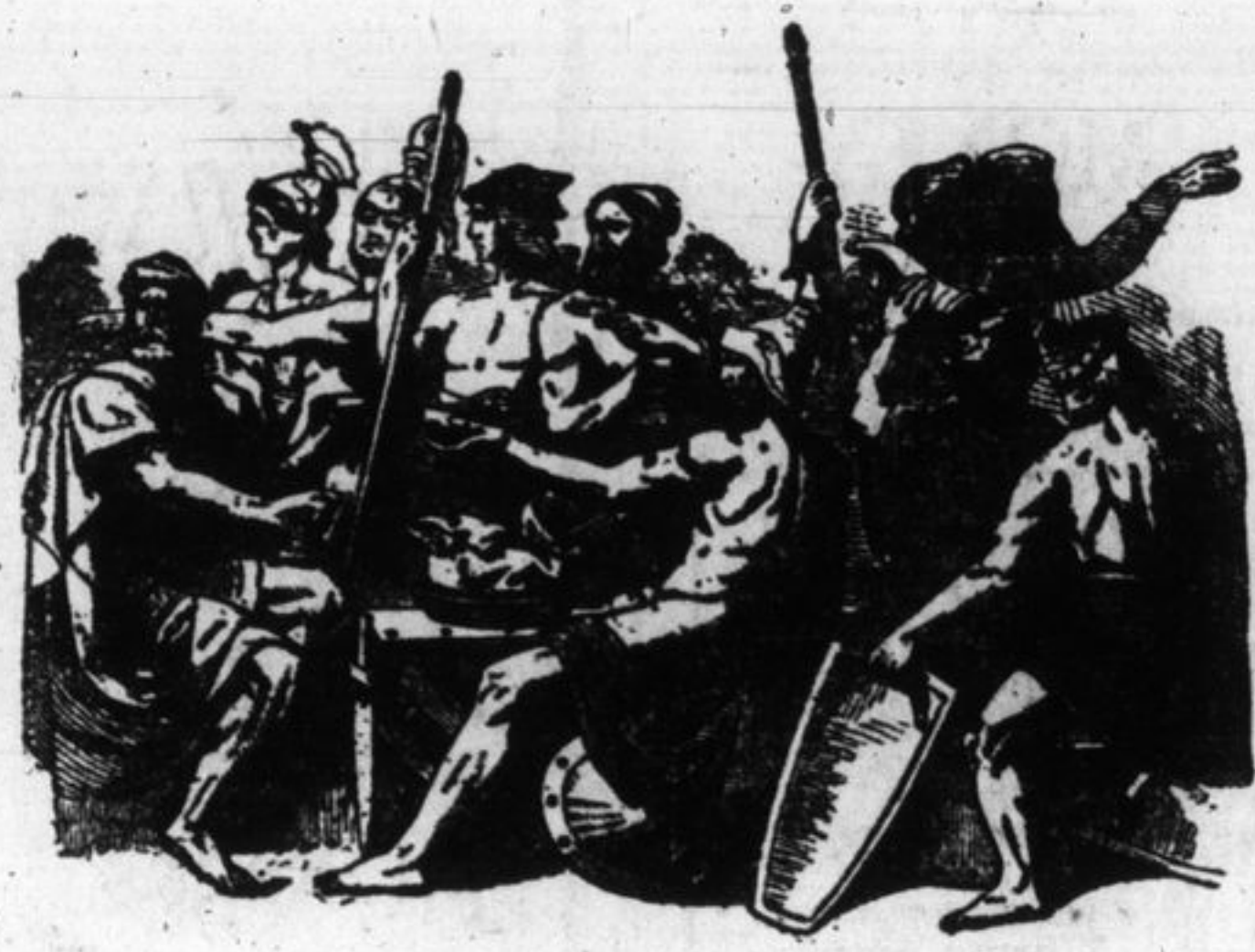

Brockville, Dec. 11.—"Kitty B," the thirteen-year-old pet cat of Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Rogers, 174 King street west, died last week and yesterday the funeral was held. The couple are without children. The remains were placed in a crib, which had been its sleeping place and a local tinsmith was commissioned to construct a galvanized iron casket in which the crib was placed. Brockville, Dec. 11.—"Glenora Park," the handsome summer residence west of the town on the St. Lawrence, facing McDonnell's Bay, has, it is learned, been purchased by Mark Workman, of Montreal, the steel and clothing magnate, from Lorne C. Corwall, Dec. 11.—Allan M.
