deceased was fifty-five years of age  
and resided in New Brunswick all  
his life. His wife predeceased him  
but there are surviving three daugh-  
ters, one son, three sisters, and two  
brothers, one of whom is Michael  
Bohan, proprietor of the British Am-  
erican Hotel, Kingston. Mr. Bohan  
went to Bath, N.B., a week ago,  
accompanied by his son, Edward,  
when notified of the serious illness  
of his brother there.

**War Relic of Toth.**  
The Prince of Wales took back  
with him from Canada the sword of  
Edmund street, which he will place  
beside the Lamp of Remembrance  
at All Hallows Barking-by-the-Tower  
during the Anniversary Celebration  
of Toth, on Dec. 15th. Edmund  
Street was the first officer apart  
from two survivors, to serve the first  
Talbot House. He was born of an  
old Loyalist family in South Ontario,  
educated at Toronto and King-  
ston. Ill-health withdrew him from  
the army before the war, but he suc-  
ceeded in rejoining the Sherwood  
Forerosters in August, 1914, and was  
with them in France from the first  
until his death, when second in  
command on the Somme in 1916.  
Edmund Street's sword will rest  
henceforth near the Lamp.
