

## Kingston Has About Thirteen Miles Of Permanently Paved Roadways

More in Proportion to Any Other City of Its Size in Canada-What City Engineer Dick's Tabulated Statement Shows.

Kingston is indeed fortunate in having more improved streets than other city of the same size in the province. Up until about fifteen years ago macadam roads were the chief thoroughfares in the city, but several aldermen thought that the time was ripe to carry out an extensive and permanent road building scheme. After much consideration it was decided to build a few blocks of asphalt block pavement and this proved such a success that the following year more pavement of the same type was constructed.
