S. O'CONNOR DIES IN TORONTO HOSPITAL

He Was Secretary to the President of the Defunct Home Bank.

Toronto, Dec. 17 .- Thomas S. O'Connor, private secretary to H. J. Daly, president of the defunct Home Bank, and who was held on \$30,-000 bail as a material witness for the Crown in prosecution of the directors and officials of the suspended institution, died in St. Michael's hospital early this morning-from uraemic poisoning. O'Consor was placed in the institution yesterday morning following complaints of pains in his head which he attributed to a fall while entering his apartment on Jarvis street on Friday night. The injury is said to have been contributory to his death, but in the opinion of Dr. Silverthorne of the hospital staff, the cause was uraemic poisoning resulting from kidney trouble.


