HAS BEEN TOO EASY.

In Its Treatment of Unfriendly Office Holders.

The Halifax bye-election result stirred up the wrath of some Liberals in Nova Scotia. The Eastern Chronicle of New Glasgow thinks the present federal government has been too easy in its treatment of office holders not of its party and not severe enough in its cutting of protection out of the tariff. Here is what it is quoted as saying:

"The workingmen's vote went against the Liberal candidate; a least so it is stated in the Halifax newspapers. It is probable that the events in Cape Breton during the past year account for that. If the statement concerning the way the workers voted be correct, then the voting was carried out by design, and as far as law and order is concerned it may be taken as a direct challenge to the Liberal party. But, until the Liberal party shakes itself clear of the dregs of Toryism it will not be in condition to accept a challenge from anyone. The party has a bunch of Tories in office here and there of their own appointment; even in the cabinet are some of the most profound Tories in Canada, and seven out of every eight public officials in Canada have been put there and walled round by the Conservative party, and the King government has not had the pluck to tear down the wall insofar to as give heir own supporters their fair share of these offices. Furthermore, we want to tell our friends at Ottawa that unless they cut decayed branches off the tariff before the next election their defeat is certain. Why not throw the iniquitous tariff schedules to the Progressives and let them tear them to pieces? Of course, the protectionists in the government would weep, but let them weep and be damned!"
