Big Rush of Mail.

That there is no falling off in the giving of Christmas gifts is shown by the number of parcels going through the Kingston post office. The big rush is now on and will continue for the next five days. At the post office, on Thursday, the staff was busily engaged handling the Christmas rush. It was stated that during Wednesday night, 140 bags of mail arrived from the west, while the mail from the east was nearly as large. On Thursday forenoon, over one hundred bags of mail arrived at the local post office. The staff is doing everything possible to dispose of the mail as speedily as possible. On Thursday three rigs were in use to help in the distribution of mail, while on Saturday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday twenty rigs will be used.
