BISHOP FALLON TO TAKE ACTION IN BANK CASE

Will Make Application for Set-off in Accounts of Money Paid In.

Toronto, Dec. 28.—His Lordship Bishop Fallon, of London diocese, will in the course of a few days make application for a set-off in accounts of the Home Bank of Canada of moneys which are said to be the property of the diocese and not the parties in whose names the accounts stand.

On the date of the bank's suspension there was on deposit in the Home Bank some \$21,000 in the names of several of the parish priests of the diocese, who deposited the money for the church in their own names.

The bank suspended in Toronto about three o'clock last time, which would be two o'clock in London. About 2.45 on the date of suspension, Bishop Fallon paid to the Bank in London, a marked cheque for \$32,000 of diocesan money. He now claims the right of set-off of the \$21,000 against the \$32,000, which means that instead of paying the \$32,000 he should pay only \$11,000, and seeks the return of the difference.

CHINAMEN REPLACED BY WOMEN WORKERS

The General Hospital Appoints Charles Greer in Charge of Laundry.

Under the re-organization scheme which is taking place at the Kingston General Hospital, the Chinamen who have been working in the laundry, have been replaced by women. Charles Greer, who for years was employed at the Imperial laundry, has been engaged to take charge of the hospital laundry. The women took over their new duties on Monday morning. Up until a year ago, the laundry work at the hospital was done by women but they were replaced by Chinamen. The new laundry, which was recently built on King street next to the new isolation building, is now in use.

An Unknown Man Attacked A Woman on Lower Albert Street.
