
Golden Wedding.

COSTS FLUCTUATE MUCH LESS THAN TOTAL INCOME HENCE NET INCOME FLUCTUATES VERY WIDELY

Certain businesses show wide fluctuation in not earnings from year to year. One such business is the steel industry. Just what is the cause of this condition?

There are two main reasons why net earnings of steel companies fluctuate so much:

First: The demand for steel products varies greatly, according to business in general.

Second: This fluctuation is accentuated by the fact that fixed charges and overhead are a larger per cent. of operating costs than in the average type of business. There are interest charges and depreciation on millions of dollars invested in plant and equipment, and minimum labor charges which must be paid whether business is good or not.

All this means that in poor times when earnings of all sorts of companies are smaller, the steel companies, instead of merely showing a reduced het, may be forced to spend all earnings for these fixed expenses, and show no net at all. They cannot reduce operating costs in the same proportion that business falls

The net earnings of a steel company may jump from 0 to 20 per cent in a year, while those of another type range only from 5 to 10
