HINTS FOR THE MOTORIST

Goldproofing Transmission Lubrication

IF THE GEAR-SHIFT LEVER moves hard on cold mornings, it is probably because the transmission lubricant between the sliding gears and the fluted shaft on which they move has become very stiff and if there is some difficulty in meshing gears, especially right after starting the car, it is presumably because the countershaft gears are brought to rest, by the resistance of the congealed oil into which they dip almost instantly upon clutch release, so that they cannot readily be made to mesh with the sliding gears, which are kept turning by car movement.



D. J. B. writes: Since installing in the intake of my engine a device for causing the re-evaporation of condensed fuel and setting the ignition-cam for a little greater spark advance, the engine has considerably more pep, but I have to retard the spark lever considerably more in order to avoid a peculiar little knock that resembles the sound produced by shaking a small piece of metal in a glass tumbler.

Answer: We believe that the oil pumping to which this engine was rather subject, has been overcome in recent models and, as the bore and stroke employed have not been altered, it is quite possible that the new constant-clearance pistons now being used can be installed in your engine. Your best course is to follow the advice of an authorized representative of this manufacturer as to what you should do in the way of piston and ring equipment, first making sure that your cylinder bores are not too badly worn. If shoring proves advisable, you better have it done by a mechanic of their own type used.
