Magazine writes: The military side of Kingston's early life has exercised a profound influence. 1812 the town was small, but the brought a stream of British gold and left a legacy of extravagance not unmarked by ambition which subsequent events did not justify. The wealth so rapidly and easily gained,' Prof., Adam Shortt has written, "was not an unmixed blessing. It fostered a spirit of extravagance for which there was no permanent support, and caused a reckless embarking in enterprises which had on reasonable promise of permanence or profit. The general moral and social atmosphere of the town also suffering from the relaxing influence of the war boom, and the influx of a considerable number of loose fish from various quarters Many of these came from the United States, to which the war had not brought prosperity, though after the peace all forms of industry revived. In fact, considering its size surroundings and prospects, Kingston had become after the war (of 1912) an extravagant, fashionable and even sinful town. yet there was a minority of shrewd, well-informed and public-spirited
