CANADA'S RESOURCES AND PROSPECTS REVEAL ENCOURAGING BASIS OF GROWTH

Bankers of World Amazed by the Economic "Comeback" of the Dominion—No Ground for Anything But Sane Optimism—Tourist Trade for 1923

An informal recapitulation and survey of Canada's resources and prospects at the threshold of the year 1924 justifies the prediction of a series of years in which trade, industry and agriculture will steadily contribute to the prosperity of a rapidly growing market.

Between 1900 and 1918, the number of manufacturing establishments in Canada increased from 14,600 to 35,000, and the value of manufactured products increased from \$481,000,000 to \$3,455,000,000.

Canada is very rich in water power, an abundant supply of power at reasonable prices is available for the country which enables Canada to plan further to compete industrially.

National Wealth Increasing. Canada's national wealth is estimated by the Dominion's Bureau of Statistics at \$22,482,841,182

In the investment field Canada surprised the financiers of the Dominion, Great Britain and the United States by absorbing during the month of October upwards of \$300,000,000 of Canadian securities.

Tourist Trade. Building for the first eleven months of 1923 was approximately thirteen per cent. in advance of that of 1922.

Business Facts. Canada now has a population of close to 5,000,000, an increase of 64 per cent. over the population of 1901.

USE OF ELECTRICITY BECOMING UNIVERSAL

Vast Generating Plants Will Shortly Be Needed to Accommodate Demand.

That the world in general is waking up to not only the importance but the need of "doing it electrically" is indisputably proved by a statement made by an executive of one of the largest electrical companies, who says that by 1930 the present electrical supply will be doubled.

When it is considered that electric service, at best, is only forty years old and that it is believed that between 1923 and 1930—that is, within a period of seven years—the electrical supply will have to be doubled what it is today, this means that industry will be called upon to create, within seven years, as much as it has created so far during its entire history.

According to one authority, one of the established facts is that "the United States can use to advantage practically all the electric energy that can be generated within its borders."

The superiority of electricity for lighting; for driving industrial and mining machinery; for producing heat for industrial processes; for the manufacture of many chemical compounds such as abrasives and fertilizer; for supplying power on the farm, for cooking, heating and operating a variety of labor-saving devices in the home and for every form of transportation—the superiority of electricity for performing all these tasks is recognized.

Therefore the use of electricity in America is limited only by the amount of power that can be generated and as our natural resources will here stand us in good stead, this generation and the next need have no fear as to the "giving out" of electricity.
